The experience of visiting this remote part of Sarawak is slow travel at its best, and it is pure bliss.

Speaking of slow travel, you'll want to know about a very pleasant and peaceful way to experience luxurious living



in the middle of London - on a revitalised barge (p22)! Also, if you're in Penang state, hop on over to the mainland side, Seberang Perai where a fantastic foodie trail - from thick and aromatic fish head curry to 15 types of durian - and hiking adventures await (p33). We've got so many more places to explore, so let's get going!

A young Sabahan multi-hyphenate paves his own path to success

Known for his funny videos with his grandmother, Adam Shamil has grown leaps and bounds since his early YouTube days. Today, the Kota Kinabalu-born lad, 29, has carved a name for himself as a professional emcee, content creator and singer-songwriter.

How did you first get into content creation?

I started making videos in 2016, when my Peninsular Malaysian friends thought that I was Indonesian from the way I speak. To address issues pertaining to the misconception of Sabah and Sarawak, I decided to start a YouTube series titled Get It Right which amassed millions of views across social media. That became the starting point of my career. The latest music video that has gained the most traction is for my single "Mansau". It's written by award-winning songwriter Benn Simon Bukag and is about local Sabahans who miss their friends, and everything about home. On YouTube, as of this writing, it has 9 million views and counting!

Your grandmother, Rose Cheam, is often featured in your videos. How did you get her to agree to do videos with you?

Honestly, when I first started making videos, my grandmother wasn't aware that I was recording her. If you look at the videos from the earlier days, everything that you see is raw and not staged. My grandmother



A young Sarawakian luthier makes international waves Samuel Wong Li Wei, 26, recently made a splash in the international world of luthiery, or the construction and repair of stringed instruments. He won a silver medal for his crafted violin, Martha, in the 17th International Violin-making Competition organised by the National Association of Artistic Italian Lutherie (ANLAI) in Pisogne, Italy, last June. Here, he talks about his blossoming luthiery career.

How did you start as a luthier?

There are few luthiers in Malaysia, as violin making is not a very common profession. I was deeply drawn to the structure of the violin even before I started my undergraduate degree in violin performance. It was only after completing my degree that I chose to pursue a career in luthiery.

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To me, a humble attitude in learning is also essential"

Working at Deciso – a violin workshop and music school in Bandar Sri Damansara in Selangor – under veteran luthier Tan Chin Seng has been fulfilling and rewarding. I'm fully committed to devoting all my passion and efforts to my work as a luthier.

What does it take to become a violin maker?

Violin making involves a high level of patience and sensitivity, plus deft hands and sharp eyes. Every detail of the instrument, be it large or small, must be crafted with the utmost dedication. Without a heart for it, there is no point in making or playing the instrument. To me, a humble attitude in learning is also essential.

What is it like to be a Sarawakian making waves on the international stage?

In recent years, we've seen more Sarawakians making waves internationally, such as diver Dato' Pandelela Rinong and musician Alena Murang. I do believe that we Borneans are a talented bunch, and I'm proud to be another Sarawakian making a wave. With the recent win at the 17th ANLAI competition in Italy, my role as a craftsman now takes on a different dimension. I will strive to build up my skills and experience in violin making so that in years to come, I may represent Malaysia in the most challenging and prestigious international competitions. *deciso.my*

Life in the slow lane


Slow living in the middle of **London**? Yes, on a refurbished luxury barge by REBECCA HALL

The 24/7 hum of London is alluring

and, at times, intimidating. As a frequent business traveller to the city, I have seen boats moored along the canals and wondered if they were open to visitors seeking a slower living experience of London. A web search led me to the *Papillon*, a century-old, 55ft barge on its permanent mooring in Little Venice, that opened in the summer of 2022.

Boat hotel stays are seen as a novelty, but my time aboard the *Papillon* was an escape to nature – right in the middle of London, no less! Sequestered in an affluent residential portion of the Grand Union Canal near Paddington Basin, the cacophony of city life is kept at bay, and I could properly enjoy the scene before me; willow trees bending into the water, canal waves splashing against the sides of the boat and waterfowl gracefully gliding by.

The *Papillon* is simple and modern. Inspired by the soothing Japandi (Japanese and Scandinavian) aesthetic, the interior living space features birchwood panels on the walls, clean

eateries like the oak-panelled Warwick Castle, which serves delicious traditional Sunday roasts amongst its extensive pub menu, and the London Shell Co, a popular seafood barge restaurant that cruises to Camden and back as you dine.

Enjoying the city while escaping its bustle is exactly what barge owner and former full-time set designer Sam Barbic intended for boat guests when she started Boutique Barges in 2014. She now leases out two boats: the *Papillon* (formerly called *Big Boat*) and *Velvet Morning*, a 53ft narrow boat that sleeps four. Barbic also provides WiFi for those looking for a unique workation.

"London living often means being crammed in flats with little access to nature," Barbic shares. "The canals run through the middle of the city, presenting an opportunity to base yourself centrally, yet have the space and environment for more freedom. Owning a boat helped me realise canal lifestyle is an antidote to city life. Its proximity to nature, and the relaxing effect of being close to water, induce a sense of calm." **boutiquebarges.co.uk**

and symmetrical lines, plus cotton and linen fabrics in muted colours. In the bedroom is a raised double bed with soft pillows and a feather duvet, while the living area can be converted into a spare bedroom for up to three more. The kitchen – Smeg appliances and a steel worktop – is small but luxurious. On balmy summer evenings, the *Papillon's* roof terrace is perfect for watching the world go by, and with its log-burning stove, winter would be a cosy time for an evening indoors with loved ones.

Despite being moored alongside the public towpath, there is minimal noise at night. Rising from a good night's sleep, the morning view through the open front doors is of moorhens jumping onto the front deck, puttering amidst potted ferns. Fresh bread, local jams, coffee, tea and milk are provided on the *Papillon* for a light breakfast. Nearby are

Café #999

Overlooking stunning views of Al Bidda Park and the West Bay skyline, this upscale modern Italian restaurant has an enviable location within Fire Station, the city's contemporary art hub. The brainchild of Groupe Ducasse Paris, it serves beloved flavours from Italy, including penne all'arrabiata, though it is the chocolate and hazelnut dessert pizza that's a must try. Keep your eyes peeled for the brick oven that proudly displays colourful graffiti by Qatari artist Mubarak Al-Malik. **999cafe.com**

Attend live music TV shows

K-pop acts hit up TV shows such as Music Bank, Show! Music Core and Inkigayo when promoting new releases. Attend these live shows to watch your idols and enjoy the performances of other artistes free of charge. Tickets to KBS Musicbank and MBC Music Core are up for lottery on their respective websites, while details for the Simply K-pop live show applications are posted on their X (formerly Twitter) account weekly.

2 Head down to a radio show

Bands making a comeback will guest on radio shows - some also hosted by popular idols - that are open to lucky fans for viewing. Picture this: you standing in the front row, gazing at your K-Pop bias for two hours (or more) as they sing, dance and joke around. Bliss! MBC Idol Radio is hosted by Ateez's Yunho and Hongjoong, KBS Kiss The Radio is helmed by Day6's YoungK, and solo singer Heize fronts KBS Volume Up.


3 Visit agency cafés

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Entertainment agencies have their own cafés where you can stock up on band merchandise and limited edition releases during comeback season. Café de Konnect sits on the ground floor of Konnect Entertainment, founded by ex-Wanna One's Kang Daniel. Over the Rainbow Café is located at RBW Tower, which is home to acts like Mamamoo and ONEWE. SM Entertainment's SMT Lounge is also a popular haunt for K-pop fans.

1 Ayana Farm Jimbaran

Flex your green thumbs at the recently reconceptualised 2ha edible botanic garden at the sprawling Ayana Estate in Jimbaran. Here, you can learn more about sustainable farming practices and Bali's traditional farming methods. Through its Rediscover Agriculture initiative, visitors can engage in guided walks, hands-on

workshops and try their hand at farming practices like planting and harvesting. Ayana Farm's Apotek Hidup, a living pharmacy, showcases local plants and herbs used in traditional medicine, while its Farm-to-Bar Workshop invites guests to craft personalised cocktails and mocktails with freshly harvested edible flowers, herbs and spices. ayana. com/bali








2 Desa Hay Canggu

Tucked away in southern Bali's Canggu area, this familyowned boutique resort preserves up to 40 percent of its land as green space, with its six villas harmoniously blending into the surrounding verdant forests. Powered by solar energy, the resort provides eco-friendly amenities like bamboo toothbrushes and biodegradable slippers made from coconut husks and mendong, water grass used in craftware. All the ingredients used in the restaurants are sourced locally and waste is carefully managed through a composting scheme. desahay.com

3 The Apurva Kempinski Bali Nusa Dua

Set atop a majestic cliff in Nusa Dua, this swanky resort is



renowned for Koral, the first aquarium restaurant in Bali. It recently introduced a new four-course "Locaflair" menu that features freshly handpicked ingredients from the resort's rooftop hydroponic garden. In addition, the resort has established partnerships with local farmers, certified sustainable fishing practitioners and local coffee artisans to ensure they're sourcing only the highest quality ingredients. The dishes are a celebration of

natural flavours and textures, such as the zesty Limau (poached prawn paired with watercress salad) and the sweet and nutty Kemiri (white snapper ballotine). *kempinski. com/en/the-apurvakempinski-bali*

4 Jumeirah Bali *Uluwatu*

Located in the southwest corner of Bali, this exclusive all-villa luxury resort in Uluwatu is the perfect

blend of luxury and history. Inspired by Javanese-Hindu culture, Jumeirah Bali's sustainable architecture reflects the ancient Majapahit's Amartha Water Palace, with the use of local materials such as teak and timber, and a sophisticated water conservation system of cascades, streams and pools. Other initiatives include advanced desalination and waste management, as well as community recycling efforts. At the oceanfront



Segaran Dining Terrace, they take a farm-to-table approach, serving meticulously crafted Indonesian flavours, such as *dadar gulung* (coconut pancake) made with palm jaggery and mango compôte. **jumeirah.com**

5 Waterbom Bali *Kuta*

The already popular waterpark looks set to attract a new group of travellers eco-tourists. With the 3.8ha park built around existing flora and fauna in Kuta, over 50 percent of the area's greenery has been preserved and the park is the first carbon-neutral tourism operation in Bali. After a recent 1.3ha expansion, the park now features a 20m-high slide tower that features solar panels. waterbombali.com



ESCAPE Head for the mountains

From hot tubs that overlook the **Kathmandu** Valley to swimming pools filled with lake water, Nepal's nature retreats take relaxation to a whole new level

virgin nature and pristine snowcapped mountains, the beautiful countryside of Nepal offer captivating places to stay. Next time you find yourself in this landlocked country in South Asia, skip Kathmandu and Pokhara and head to these nature-filled retreats instead.

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Namo Buddha Resort

40km from Kathmandu airport

At Namo Buddha Resort, cottages are built in the traditional Nepali architectural style, replete with delicately carved wood accents and a characteristic small wooden door that necessitates a bow while entering. Encircled by pine and Himalayan cherry trees, and, set within a garden

lush with camellias and daisies, the cottages are literally ensconced in nature. Taking a farm-totable approach to food, the meals here showcase seasonal delights such as pumpkin soup, orange juice and avocado salad, with many vegetables grown on-site. The resort also organises guided treks to the

nearby village of Phulbari or visits to the ancient trade route of Dapcha Chhatrebang town. From the resort, vou can also trek to Panauti – about three to five hours away – an ancient town known for its artistic flair and historical monuments. namobuddha resort.com









Begnas Lake Resort 200km from Kathmandu Airport

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In the lap of the spring-fed waters of Pokhara's Begnas Lake, where waterfowl and forest species co-exist harmoniously, this charming lakeside resort attracts ecoconscious nature lovers. The cottages here are built using local stone, bamboo and clay, with porches that look out to the magnificent countryside and majestic Himalayan peaks. Few resorts master environmental

commitment, but Begnas Lake Resort has nailed it. Its green practices such as a swimming pool filled with lake water, pesticidefree gardens and a biogas plant that uses organic waste generated on the premises to support cooking in the kitchen. Explore the area's flora and fauna on foot or take a boat out for a spot of birdwatching. begnaslakeresort. com

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Shivapuri Heights Cottage 13km from Kathmandu airport

Tucked away on the fringes of the Shivapuri Nagarjun National Park, this secluded haven surrounded by pine and rhododendron trees is where digital nomads can find their zen. Blend work and leisure from the comforts of your wood-andbrick cottage or "glamps" (luxurious tents with attached bathroom and shower), and enjoy home-cooked meals made from fresh, seasonal vegetables. Stretch those muscles with a short but invigorating hike to the Jamchen Vijaya Stupa before pampering yourself with a spa session or an Ayurvedic massage back at the resort. After a long day, unwind with a dip in the plunge pool or simply relax in the hot tub that overlooks pictureperfect views of the Kathmandu Valley. Foodies can also look forward to cooking classes featuring steamed dumplings and pickles. *shiva* puricottage.com





A Malaysian in... Tokyo

Cheesie, the Johor Bahru-born blogger and content creator who focuses on Japanese culture and destinations, shares her favourite places to eat, relax and find creative inspiration in Tokyo **BY STEPHANIE YEAP**



I was born in Johor Bahru and

now live in Tokyo, where I work in the inbound tourism industry. I started my blog *Cheeserland. com* 19 years ago as a personal diary to explore my interests in Japanese "gyaru" fashion and culture, which I discovered after watching anime and J-dramas as a teenager. It's a style that plays on youth and femininity.

A highlight of my blogging career was being featured on the Japanese national television channel NHK when a production team came to Kuala Lumpur in 2011. I was attending university then and they were looking for people who loved Japanese style. Soon after I would get invited on business trips to Japan to promote its fashion and culture to people in Southeast Asia. These days, I work with local prefecture governments, producing content that promotes the attractions, culture and history of the different regions. I'm making my way through Japan's 47 prefectures, and have blogged about 38 so far.

I moved to Tokyo in March 2020. This was an impulsive move, as I wanted to be in Japan and continue work there before the borders shut. I love living here – Tokyo is a great base for me as it is close to Haneda airport and the Shinkansen rail, making it easy for me to visit other prefectures for work. Retail therapy

Preloved fashion is popular in Japan. For a day of vintage clothing shopping, I'd recommend Shimokitazawa, a buzzy neighbourhood filled with secondhand stores. Head to **Flamingo** where they take older pieces and rework them. I used to be a big fan of "gyaru" fashion before I had children, but now I dress more simply and try to support homegrown brands. One of my





favourites is **Public Tokyo**. The designs are more casual, but the clothing is made locally and is of high-quality. *Flamingo* (2-25-12 *Kitazawa, Setagaya Ward*), *Public Tokyo* (7/F Shibuya Scramble Square, 2-24-12 Shibuya)

My quiet time

To unwind, I love going to a peaceful shrine to read or jot down my thoughts on my phone for hours on end. One that I particularly like is **Nezu Shrine**. Located close to Ueno Park,







it is famous for a scenic path lined with *torii* (traditional red Japanese gate), which reminds me of the famous Fushimi Inari Taisha shrine in Kyoto. It's also particularly beautiful in spring when the azalea bushes come into bloom. *1 Chome-28-9 Nezu*, *Bunkyo City*

Sublime desserts

The hip neighbourhood of Yoyogi-Uehara is home to many cafés and dessert shops. I recently discovered **Bien-Être Maison**, which specialises in parfaits made with seasonal ingredients. They also have a tantalising selection of crêpes and cakes. During a recent visit, I ordered a parfait with perilla leaves and cherries, which come into season in early summer. The café usually only accepts reservations, so be sure to book ahead. *1 Chome-17-11 2F 3F*, *Uehara, Shibuya*

The kids love it

I love taking my two children – aged seven and nine years – to **Keio Rail Land**. Located in the Western Tokyo suburbs, it's a great place for young ones as they can learn how trains work and simulate operating them. There are also several indoor playgrounds there, with our favourite being HugHug right next to Keio Rail Land. **3-36-39 Hodokubo, Hino**

Game for a fusion meal

My favourite restaurant to bring friends is **Gourmands**, which is located in Shin-ochanomizu station. It's fusion-French bistro but what's special is that the chef Hiroki-san is a hunter! He serves wild game and more traditional meats like beef, so there is a good selection. *2 Chome-23 Kanda Awajicho, Chiyoda City*

Tea in a quiet 'hood

Jiyugaoka in Meguro may be a lesser-known neighbourhood but its quiet charms draw me back time and again. It's a stylish area with European-style architecture and is notably home to a miniature recreation of Venice, replete with a red brick bridge, small canal and even a gondola! Whenever I'm here, I make it a point to visit Kosoan Teahouse, because traditional Japanese teahouses can be hard to find in metropolitan Tokyo. On a recent visit, I ordered zenzai (red bean soup dessert with roasted mochi), which was warm and comforting. 1 Chome-24-23 Jiyugaoka, Meguro City

Reset and recharge

For a spot of nature, I recommend visiting the city of Akiruno in Western Tokyo, home to the Akigawa hot springs and Seoto no Yu, one of the best natural onsens in the Japanese capital. Then there's also Hinohara in the district of Nishitama, which is Tokyo's last remaining village. It's hidden in a forested, mountainous area so you'd have to take a long ride on a local train, before catching a bus to the village. *Seoto* no Yu (565 Otsu, Akiruno), Hinohara-mura (Nishitama District)

A slice of history

As a long-time enthusiast of Japanese culture and history, the pre-war neighbourhood of Yanaka Ginza interests me. It wasn't burnt down during the air raids in World War Two so there are many historical buildings remaining. Here, you'll find a mix of modern cafés and traditional shops selling crafts and ceramics. There are also shops that offer opportunities to try your hand at calligraphy or experience the traditional Japanese tea ceremony. 3 Chome-13-1 Yanaka, Taito City

Seberang Perai

Located on the northwest coast of Peninsular Malaysia, the state of Penang is beloved for its heritage, natural attractions and great food.

Penang comprises two urban areas: George Town, the Unesco World Heritage Site on the island of Penang, and Seberang Perai, a large district located on the mainland, about an hour's drive from the airport.

Though less well-known internationally than Penang Island, Seberang Perai – or Province Wellesley as it was known during colonial times – also has much to offer in the way of food and nature. Even archaeology lovers will also appreciate its location an hour south of Lembah Bujang in Kedah, the site of Southeast Asia's earliest human civilisation.

Before you start your exploration of mainland Penang, first stop and admire the distinctive blue Perai River Swing Bridge, built in 1964 over the scenic body of water.

The structure not only connects the northern Butterworth Railway Terminal to southern destinations in Peninsular Malaysia, but also swings open to let larger barges and ships pass through.

From there, it's time for a full day for urban food hunting and a spot of hiking to burn off the meals.

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Saturday

① 6am Fitness with a view of Penang Island

Start your day bright and early with a morning walk or jog along the coastal road of Pantai Bersih as the sun rises. Literally named "clean beach", this stretch of coastline in Butterworth offers sweeping panoramas of Penang Island that are especially pretty on sunny days. *Pantai Bersih, 13000 Butterworth*

② 8am Hearty breakfast

After a vigorous workout, it's time to rest and refuel. At **Restoran Noor Mohamed**, tuck into a flavourful plate of *mee goreng sotong*, a popular dish of yellow noodles stir-fried with dried cuttlefish, boiled potatoes, egg and tofu.

For lighter fare, visit **Tong Kok Kopi Café** where Malaysian breakfast delights such as nasi lemak, free-range half boiled eggs, butter cake and Bengali roti with homemade *kaya* (coconut jam) are served alongside aromatic local brews. The menu also presents a selection of local noodle dishes. *3227, Jalan Kampung Benggali, Kampung Benggali, 12000 Butterworth; 1, Jalan Bukit Tambun, Taman Bagan Tambun, 14100 Simpang Ampat*

(1) 10am Hiking and fruit farm visit

Once you've filled your belly, take the 40-minute hike up to **Suling Hill** – also known as Bukit Langkap - in Kubang Semang, Bukit Mertajam. The trail offers postcard-perfect views of Bukit Mertajam city and its surrounding villages, Mengkuang Dam, as well as Penang Island on the horizon. At the top is a private meditation retreat. Visitors are welcome to explore the grounds - meditation pavilions sit beside small ponds amid banana and palm trees - without disrupting any ongoing meditation sessions. There's even a fruit farm, where you can purchase a wide selection of local fruits, including rambutan, mangosteen and 15 varieties of Malaysia's "king of fruits", the infamous durian.

Still raring to go and ready for a second hike? Head to **Bukit Berapit**, a 4.7-km loop on the northern side of the Bukit Mertajam Recreational Forest. The trek can be done in a single loop or split into two trails: one takes you to a majestic Thai-Burmese Buddhist temple built into the hillside, and the other leads to the colourful 328 Rainbow Stairs. *Suling Hill (Bukit Langkap),* 14400 Bukit Mertajam; Google Maps: Berapit Hill Hiking

① 12pm A seafood lunch

There's a reason why **Ong Cheng Huat** is so popular with visitors – this no-frills restaurant in Butterworth serves up an array of local delights that are both tasty and affordable. Tuck into mouthwatering dishes such as deepfried spring chicken, *heh piah* (prawn fritters) and blanched baby octopus. Wash it down with a refreshing glass of fermented coconut water. *Closed on Mondays. 6093, Kampung Pokok Keras, 13400 Butterworth*



(b) 3pm Street art spotting


A visit to Seberang Perai is incomplete without popping by the quaint **Bukit Tambun** town. This fishing village is lined with heritage shophouses, some with murals featuring stars like Bruce Lee and Chow Yun-Fat, alongside characters from *Toy Story* and *SpongeBob SquarePants*. There are also murals depicting local life, including a fisherman reeling in his net, and quirky ones like a horse carriage that looks like it's breaking through the wall. *Bukit Tambun Street Art Murals, 24, 149, Bukit Tambun, 14100 Simpang Ampat*

() 4pm Local treats for afternoon tea

Onde-onde with gula melaka (rice cake balls with coconut flakes and palm syrup filling), and pulut tekan with kaya (glutinous rice cake with coconut jam) at the spacious double-storey **Dua Sua Ka X De Antique Cafe** make for a delicious teatime treat. 49, Jln Arumugam Pillai, 14000 Bukit Mertajam

⑦ 7pm Dinner in a Beatlesinspired bistro

Abbey Road Bistro Restaurant in Seberang Jaya is dedicated to – you guessed it – The Beatles, and serves bistro classics with premium wines. A must-try for seafood lovers is the Signature Lobster Thermidor (preorder), while dessert has to be the Iconic Blue Box. This chocolate sea salt cake with a white marshmallow ribbon is a nod to the blue gift box from Tiffany & Co. Beatles fans will enjoy the vintage band photos everywhere. *Closed on Sundays. 6-GF, Lebuh Tenggiri 2, Pusat Bandar Sunway, 13700 Seberang Jaya*

Rise and shine



The remote village of Long Banga in the state of Sarawak is emerging from the shadows thanks to local coffee farmers striving to put Malaysian Liberica beans on the world map



S

eated in a George Town café this past July, I glance at a menu filled with names of imported coffee beans from as far

as Honduras and Ethiopia. I'm about to order an espresso when an unusual item sparks my curiosity: Liberica coffee beans cultivated in Malaysia? I had frankly never heard of it but a quick Google search tells me the Liberica bean originates from West Africa. My interest is piqued.

When my cuppa finally arrives, the very first sip confounds my expectations. My tastebuds are more attuned to the sweeter flavours and chocolatey aromatics of Arabica beans. Liberica's almond-shaped beans, on the other hand, have a slightly smoky flavour and a unique floral aroma. As I continue sipping and getting acquainted with this new bittersweet aftertaste, I recall a conversation from awhile back.

"You should check out what the local coffee farmers are doing in Long Banga," Alasdair Clayre had told me. He is a personal friend and an anthropology Ph.D candidate at the Universiti Malaysia Sarawak (UNIMAS) whose ongoing dissertation is on the identity politics of the Sa'ban *orang asal* (an umbrella term for the 60-something native ethnic groups of Sarawak and Sabah). We last met at Miri's Borneo Jazz Festival in June 2022.

The village he is referring to lies in a remote area on the upper reaches of Sarawak's Baram River, and even though it's quite sprawling, it only has about 300 permanent residents. Clayre isn't merely invested from an academic standpoint - the connection with this remote community is a deeply personal one. Clayre's British missionary parents raised him in Long Banga until he was three years old, and since then, Clayre has returned to visit time and time again, earning the respect and acceptance of the village's Sa'ban and Kenyah Lepo Keh communities. Taking Clayre up on his offer, I decide to plan my trip to this scenic region known for its rugged, mountainous terrain and cosy homestays with orang asal families. Long Banga is also becoming an increasingly vital part of Sarawak's coffee industry, and its orang asal farmers were likely responsible for cultivating the beans that went into my aromatic cup of Liberica.

Like the ugly duckling of the coffee world, Liberica roughly accounts for only 2% of global coffee production and is best appreciated among niche speciality coffee connoisseurs – mainly because compared to the average 20% cherry-to-bean yield of the staple Arabica and Canephora or Robusta plants, Liberica's crops only produce 7%.

But because Liberica can grow below 800m of altitude, the plant adapts very well to lowland tropical Southeast Asia countries like Malaysia, Indonesia and the Philippines, where farmers have experimented with this brew for the past half-century. Yet it was only in October 2021 that Malaysian Liberica started getting more recognition, after beans from Johor-based coffee grower My Liberica won third place at the World Barista Championship in Italy.

THE EASIEST ROUTE TO REMOTE

Long Banga starts on the tarmac of Miri's airport. Long Banga's far-flung corner of northeastern Sarawak rubs borders with Indonesian Kalimantan and is best approached using one of the weekly flights operated by MASwings.

Using a small, unpressurised Twin Otter aircraft, the 55-minute flight to Long Banga feels like the start of an incredible Borneo adventure. We cruise at low altitude above broccoli-headed plains where the endless bends of the cappuccino-coloured Baram River unfurl like a shimmering golden snake. Soon enough, we almost touch the tip of the pristine 1,880m-high crests of the Tama Abu Range before descending amidst the rolling hills that flank Long Banga's airstrip, one of the shortest in Malaysia.

Clayre, who has agreed to act as my guide through Long Banga, is already waiting outside the only hall of this tiny airport. Our first stop is just across the airstrip - Billeng Lemdin Homestay, run by Ludia Apoi and her family. Their spacious wooden and concrete home is hemmed by verdant green fields, where they grow various crops, including Liberica plants. For entrepreneurial farmers like Ludia and her brother Madang Bilong, the success of their Liberica crops means less risk of losing produce - coffee beans aren't easily perishable, don't expire for over a year and are lighter to transport out of a mountainous region than other produce, such as pineapples or palm fruit.

Ludia greets me with a fresh cup of Liberica brew that she hand-dried and roasted. The taste is homey and fullbodied, and I relished every last drop. From there, we set out on a tour of a nearby farm operated by another Long Banga coffee farmer, Tomy Pangot and his wife, Anne. We walk through lush land dotted by fruit trees and man-sized coffee plants laden with red and plump Liberica cherries.

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Coffee beans aren't easily perishable, don't expire for over a year and and are lighter to transport out of a mountainous region"

"Liberica coffee is now produced in Serian, Kapit, Limbang, Miri, as well as the villages of Long Banga, and Uma Bawang in the Ulu Baram area," says Dr. Kenny Lee, a globe-trotting coffee specialist and co-founder of Earthlings, a Kuching-based café, wholesaler and coffee academy.

During my visit, Dr. Lee is in Long Banga to check on the health of the coffee plantations that Earthlings had set up together with the local farmers. As part of their Sarawak Liberica Refinement project, Dr. Lee and his team collaborate with several grassroots *orang asal* communities across the state to observe and improve farming methods.

Dr. Lee was also one of the co-organisers for the inaugural Borneo Coffee Symposium held in Kuching in 2019, which brought together coffee experts from across the world to discuss how to uplift Sarawak's local coffee production. The event's positive reception inspired deputy chief minister Datuk Amar Douglas Uggah to propose Sarawak as a potential major regional coffee producer of the Liberica variety, and soon after, the Department of Agriculture Sarawak donated a thousand coffee seedlings to entrepreneurial farmer families in Long Banga and other coffee-producing villages across the state.

Lee believes that Long Banga's farmers are capable of producing premium Liberica beans that can be sold at competitive prices to speciality coffee markets worldwide.

"I'll buy up to 3,000kg of beans directly from Long Banga's farmers at a higher price every year so that they will understand that if they produce goodquality Liberica beans with no visible defects and a good taste, they can sell to us at a minimum of RM35 and above per kilogram, which is double what the Fairtrade International organisation offers," says Lee.

IN BETWEEN ENJOYING

charming coffee-focused homestays and learning about Sarawak highlands' indigenous culture, I spend my days exploring the rest of Long Banga. Clayre takes me to the nearby village of Long Puak, where other indigenous farmers have started following the lead of their neighbours by planting coffee trees amidst their other crops. "We were all giving up on coffee growing as we could not sell our beans," says Gerald Bissam, the first farmer to revive coffee planting in Long Puak. "Earthlings and Alasdair showed us how to grow and process coffee for the speciality market, which pays much better."

I also spend a morning hiking through dense forest and farmland to Long Lamai, the area's most important Penan settlement, before looping back to Long Banga by hopping on a chartered longtail boat along the rapidly flowing Balong river. From Long Banga, it's possible to trek for about two hours to the churning Arol Ano waterfall and a cluster of rocks that archaeologists believe to be ancient burial sites. Guests can also walk to Long

Banga's semi-abandoned old wooden Kenyah longhouse, where a handful of families keep up the waning communal living traditions. Felicia Muller of Supang Café and Homestay can organise rental vehicles and guided trips for places farther away, such as the popular village of Bario.

On the day I am set to leave Long Banga on a long overland four-wheeldrive journey back to Miri to catch my return flight, I feel like I am leaving family behind in Long Banga – not least because the Earthlings associates, Dr. Lee and I were officially "adopted" as honorary members of the village by the local *penghulu* (village chief) Robin Udau at a farewell dinner for us at his house the previous evening.

As we drive away towards the faraway coast, I watch the tin-roofed homes of Long Banga become smaller and smaller behind us, convinced that if the local farmers keep working hard, their floral-scented Liberica brews can grow to become one of the most sought-after coffees in the world. And then, this jewel of a village won't remain under the world's radar for much longer. ■

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Empowering women



SLDB has an unwavering commitment to becoming the leading catalyst and executor of rural land development in Sabah, with a focus on the food industry. Apart from its successful ventures in palm oil, dairy farming and food production, SLDB has also diversified its businesses into other agricultural food-based products such as chillies, Bentong ginger, stingless bee honey, MD2 pineapple, pandan, coconut and peppers. This diversification enriches the community with new income opportunities and fosters a resilient agricultural landscape for sustainable growth.





CABIN LUGGAGE HANDLING Passenger and crew safety on board our flights are our highest priority. Large devices with screen size above 12 inches are not allowed to be used during takeoff and landing. Whilst cruising. all devices can be used in "Flight Mode". Devices transmitting cellular and signals to satellites must remain switched off throughout the flight, until disembarkation. The Captain may prohibit the use of devices if there is any interference with the aircraft's system.

LITHIUM BATTERIES

Lithium metal or lithium ion cells or batteries for portable electronic devices (PEDs), including medical devices, must not exceed 2g for lithium metal batteries and 100Wh for lithium ion batteries. All spare batteries, including lithium metal or lithium ion cells or batteries, for PEDs must be carried in passengers' carry-on baggage only. These batteries must be individually protected to prevent short circuits. PEDs containing non-spillable batteries, they must be 12V or less or 100Wh or less. Passengers are allowed to carry a maximum of two spare batteries onboard. These batteries must be individually protected to prevent short circuits.



Smoking, including the use of electronic cigarettes, is prohibited on all flights. Electronic cigarettes must be carried in carry-on baggage only. Recharging of the device inflight is not permitted.
