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

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

Keeping it in the family

"It was a Herculean task," says Rin Rin Wong, COO of tea sensation, Beca Tea, on the effort that went into sourcing, blending, firing and brewing their selection of teas. Difficult but necessary, as Beca Tea is an extension of a long family tradition that goes back all the way to tea plantations in Fujian, China, before coming to colonial Malaya.

"Grandpa sold tea out of a tin trunk strapped to a *beco* (trishaw), while great-grandpa processed the tea for him to sell," explains CEO PC Koh, with the name of the store a tribute to "the indomitable spirit of our forefathers in laying the foundations for our family's legacy."

Beca Tea stays true to this legacy by emphasising the natural taste of teas, whether served with milk, nitro-brewed or infused with botanicals, completely avoiding the sugars and syrups that are so often used to mask a lack of flavour. The standout is the Secret Stash – a painstakingly curated selection of the best oolong, black, white peony, green and pu'er – made available to customers at affordable prices. "We want to introduce more people to what we call 'straight teas', that is tea without all the embellishments that add extraneous flavour," notes co-founder Joshua Wong, a fifth-generation member of the family.

When founding Beca Tea, according to Koh, the family asked themselves what they would do with the centuryold legacy entrusted to them. With the passion and care that goes into each of their drinks, the evidence points to doing that legacy proud. **becatea.com**

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
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

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
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Two attractions in one quick trip out of Beijing BY STEPHEN O'CONNELL



Bathing in beauty

A wintertime trip to Osaka opens a world of glorious onsen-bathing possibilities across Japan's Kansai region BY KISSA CASTAÑEDA

You can't say that you've really immersed yourself in Japanese culture if you haven't been to an onsen. Hot spring bathing, or onsen, is a treasured ritual for the Japanese, revered for benefits such as balancing the nervous system, enhancing blood circulation, relieving pain, reducing stress and more. Rooted in Buddhist purification rituals, this wellness practice was enjoyed by the Japanese elite in the seventh century, and it reached a wider audience during the Edo period from 1630-1867.

Onsen is such an important part of Japanese culture that it has shaped the country's travel landscape. Currently, Japan has more than 3,000 hot spring resorts, and regions with mineralrich waters have become major tourist destinations. Whether you choose a vibrant public onsen or a serene ryokan, bathing in natural hot springs is a balm for the body and soul. Here are three to discover in Kansai.

1 Ryokan Fushioukaku, Osaka

While there are probably more okonomiyaki (savoury pancake) spots than onsens in Osaka, that doesn't mean there are no impressive hotspring resorts nearby. Just a 30-minute train ride from Umeda station, Ryokan Fushioukaku is a traditional hotel that's incredibly welcoming to those who are new to onsen bathing.

An authentic experience awaits at the expansive onsen facilities: there are two indoor and five outdoor baths to choose from. In general, bathers should start with the "coldest" pool, progress to warmer ones and then end in the hot baths outside, best experienced during the colder months. The ryokan also has 20 tatamistyle rooms equipped with their own open-air baths – perfect for those who like to feel free and bare it all in private. **fushioukaku.co.jp**

2 Hotel The Mitsui Kyoto

Designed by André Fu, Hotel The Mitsui Kyoto features a contemporary take on traditional Japanese design elements, such as kimono fabric reworked to become a ceiling sculpture in the lobby. This "modern ryokan" is a seamless marriage of old and new in the 161 rooms, as well as in the




public areas, including its onsen offerings.


Make time to relax in the hotel's atmospheric thermal spring spa, which features large stones peppered across the cavernous space and jacuzzi-style pools pumped with onsen water (swimwear is required). Guests can also book the private onsen suites, which have an outdoor onsen, an al fresco lounge area, indoor and outdoor showers, and a spacious changing space – everything you need for a luxurious hot-spring experience. hotelthemitsui.com

3 Yumori Onsen Hotel Suginoyu, Nara

A two-hour drive from Osaka brings you to Okuyoshino Gorge, an impossibly beautiful location far from the deer-feeding crowds of Nara. Overlooking the Yoshino River, Hotel Suginoyu is a traditional ryokan built to maximise enjoyment of the natural surroundings, including the Yoshino Japan has more than 3,000 hot spring resorts, and regions with mineralrich waters have become major tourist destinations. Senbonzakura – Japan's largest cherry blossom viewing spot with more than 300,000 sakura trees that blossom fully at the end of March.

The best way to soothe sore muscles after a day of sightseeing is to spend ample time in the *rotenburo* (outdoor onsen) to enjoy in the silky waters from Yumori onsen. The plus? It comes with a stunning view of lush forest greenery and a fresh mountain breeze that keeps you cool while you're immersed in the piping hot waters. **suginoyu.com**

Beyond borders

Combining creativity with business savvy, **Singapore**-based fashion brands are making waves in the global scene by KISSA CASTAÑEDA

Stable, transparent and efficient – these are the reasons why Singapore has been

named the best place to do business by the Economist Intelligence Unit for the last 15 years.

From TWG Tea to Grab, the Lion City has birthed some of the region's most valuable and recognisable brands. It's also a breeding ground for creative pursuits, thanks to government support, a bounty of talent and a multicultural environment that inspires creation. Here are three fashion brands with Singaporean roots that have grown beyond the Little Red Dot.





Everyday chic by Love, Bonito

In 2005, three enterprising fashion lovers launched BonitoChico, which sold pre-loved apparel targeted to millennials. As the brand grew, co-founder Rachel Lim wanted to expand its remit: to create a female fashion brand tailored to Asian shoppers.

Focusing on creating wearable pieces with thoughtful details, Love, Bonito has since become the largest omnichannel womenswear brand in Southeast Asia with stores in Hong Kong, Cambodia and the Philippines, and shipping as far as New York. Apart from being a bestselling clothing label, its almost personal relationship with its loyal community sets it apart from other fast-fashion brands. *lovebonito.com*

Edgy streetwear by Youths in Balaclava

Singaporean fashion collective Youths in Balaclava is equal parts a symbol of counterculture and sartorial innovation in the Lion City, where non-conformist attitudes are not usually celebrated. Formed in 2015 by a group of school friends, the collective now has 18 members and is known for fusing streetwear essentials with experimental,

avant-garde details.

Their rise from a local underground group to a global fashion label was cemented when they caught the attention of the Dover Street Market and began showing in London, followed by Paris. Their Spring/Summer 2024 collection, titled Hybrid Moments, showed in Paris Fashion Week. It represented different themes "ranging from racial injustice to gun violence in the United States,

honouring those who tirelessly search for beauty in the shadows", according to a report by Hypebeast. *youthsinbalaclava. com*

Wearable art by Ethan K

What do Jennifer Lopez, Hailey Bieber and Princess Beatrice have in common? They've all carried an Ethan K bag. Designer Ethan Koh's meticulously made bags are crafted from high-quality leather and are like portable works of art - so much so that they have become collectible items. A Malaysian in... Bangkok

Michelle Goh, one of Michelin Guide Asia's top female pastry chefs and one-half of the duo behind the newly starred Mia Bangkok, shares her top dining and shopping haunts in the City of Angels BY PARISA PICHITMARN



I was born in Kuching, Sarawak, in East Malaysia. I was always interested in food and grew up with my grandmothers on both sides; they both cooked a lot. My earliest memory of food is standing on a stool stirring the wok with my paternal grandmother when I was nine or 10 years old.

After secondary school, I moved to Sydney and studied at Le Cordon Bleu. I worked in Australia for three-and-a-half years until my visa ended, and then moved to Singapore to work at Pollen, the fine-dining restaurant inside the Flower Dome at the Gardens by the Bay. That's where I met my Thai husband, Pongcharn "Top" Russell, who is also a chef. He wanted to move back to Bangkok and in 2016, we did.

I started working as a pastry chef at **Suhring**, which now has

two Michelin stars. Top and I were later approached by a restaurateur to create **Mia**, which we opened in 2019. Mia offers a fine dining seasonal tasting menu, as well as an omakase dessert course showcasing French techniques with Asian flavours.

What people don't really know is that chefs are just as happy when we're not cooking – the last thing I want to be doing at home is more cooking! I love the convenience of living in Bangkok, where food delivery is everywhere. On our days off, we try to support others in the industry and love eating out in a nice place. I'm glad there are so many options in this city.

Sweet sensations

The milk tea with egg pudding at **GAGA** is super good. I think it's a textural thing. People are into *boba* (tapioca balls) but I find them to be too chewy. Egg pudding is silky, so it's like a dessert in a cup. For pastries, my all-time favourite dessert spot is **Paris Mikki**. I love the orangette cake, which is chocolate mousse shaped like an orange. There's also something about their croissants that taste different from everywhere











else. When they hold popups at EmQuartier I grab my croissants there, but I think the best branch to chill and relax is at Central Embassy. *fb.com/ gagabkk; fb.com/parismikki*

A spicy affair

My last visit to the two-Michelin-starred restaurant **Sorn** was something really special. On top of amazing food and service, it was the attention to tiny details that impressed me – there's a designated staff who fixes the toilet paper so it's folded in the shape of a leaf. It's small touches like that that separate good restaurants from great ones. I've been to Sorn multiple times, but one of the best decisions they have made is to give an option for spice level. When I first went, all their food was way too spicy for me. They said that is the way authentic southern Thai food is meant to be, but it's a smart move on their part to tone it down so it's more enjoyable for everyone. sornfinesouthern.com

Thai food for visiting friends?

If they are into street food, I take them to Jeh O Chula. It's always a fun experience with their photogenic Mama noodles. If they want Thai food, I definitely take them to Sri Trat Restaurant **& Bar**. It's my favourite and not your typical green curry sort of place. My favourite dish there is the salak soup – the snake fruit tastes savoury and I like that acidic saltiness to it. Another dish I love is their stir-fried cabbage with fish sauce. They make their own fish sauce, so it tastes different from anywhere else. instagram.com/jeh_o_ chula; fb.com/sritrat

Late-night munchies

Top and I really enjoy Daimasu. They open until late so we can still pop over after service at Mia. It's "dirty" Japanese BBQ, where all the tables and chairs are just overturned crates. You barbecue your own squid or beef set on the charcoal in front of you. There's a great vibe, worth the money; the branch at Silom takes last orders at midnight. For casual Italian, Gigi makes the best vongole in town. Their tiramisu is always good. It stays open later than others; last orders are at 11pm. mercato-group.com; gigibangkok.com

Retail temptations

When I first moved here, I went to **Platinum Fashion Mall** a lot. I try not to go anymore because I spend way too much on things I don't need! I like clothes and when you're there, everything looks cute. Now I only go when I really have to. I needed an evening dress for an event and found a perfect one there. It was cheap and good quality for THB 2,000. *fb.com/ ThePlatinumFashion MallBangkok*

Local chic

I recently found out that Jaspal is a Thai fashion brand - one of the brands under their company, **Lyn**, did a private new-collection launch event at Mia to showcase their handbags. I love the weird shoes from **Quinn**, which is another brand from the Jaspal group. One of my favourite pairs is a hot pink heel, but with a comic strip in the front. Once a small Malay fishing village known as Tanjung Puteri, Johor Bahru was renamed by Sultan Abu Bakar in 1862 as he established it as the capital of the Johor Sultanate. The city sits on the north bank of the Straits of Johor and serves as one of two landentry points into Malaysia for the island nation of Singapore. The Woodlands Causeway, completed in 1924, is one of the busiest international border crossings in the world with an estimated 350,000 travellers daily.

This symbiotic relationship with its neighbour allows "JB" to thrive as an economic powerhouse. The city may be dense, but many secret treasures are woven into its fast-paced modernity. With only a day and a morning to spare, there won't be a dull moment for shortweekend travellers to JB.

Saturday

① 7am Saluting the crown

Breathe in the fresh morning air at **Laman Mahkota Istana Bukit Serene** and walk around its vast, manicured grounds. The sense of peace that fills the place will make you understand the aptness of its name.

This must-visit garden in JB allows you a glimpse of the **Sultan of Johor's palace** and official residence that sits majestically at the top of the hill. The palace and the road leading up to it are off-limits, but the garden is dotted with iconic monuments, one of them being a replica of the meticulously carved **Johorean crown jewel** adorned by a gold star and moon. *Jalan Kolam Air*, *Bukit Serene*

② 8am Packing a punch of flavour

It's hard to miss **Gerai Cik Gunong**'s bright yellow signboard. The café, just a few minutes drive from the Sultan of Johor's palace, serves traditional Johor dishes. Enjoy a serving of traditional Johorean Malay breakfast; the *lontong kering* is a must-try. In this dry version of the popular lontong, a *kuah lodeh* (creamy coconut and vegetable gravy) and *ketupat* (rice cake) dish, the soup is replaced with stir-fried vegetables, a spoonful of dried coconut shavings, a dollop of spicy sambal, a heap of beef rendang and peanut sauce. The classic version is also available.

You might also want to try the *soto*, a spiced chicken broth poured over either noodles or rice cakes. The wellseasoned and slowly simmered soup will warm your soul. They also have various traditional Malay pastries such as curry puffs, *kuih pelita*, *burger sambal* and many others to go with coffee or a hot chocolate. Jalan Dato Musa, Kampung Pasir

① 10am Let your inner child out to play

Head over to Legoland, an hour's drive west to Iskandar Puteri. The theme park is filled with replicas made from millions of Lego bricks. Some of the sculptures are seasonal; for an adrenaline rush, there are plenty of fun rides including The Dragon (a thrilling roller coaster), LEGO NINJAGO The Ride (an advanced 4D indoor ride), and Dino Island (a splash ride on a log boat). You'll even get to meet Lego Man mascots around the park. To escape scorching temperatures, there's the Legoland Water Park filled with slides, rides and pools. Persiaran Medini Utara 3, Iskandar Puteri

() 3pm Old meets new

Back in the heart of the city, wander the cluster of streets that make up JB **Old Town** and explore an eclectic mix of fascinating businesses, some new, some old. At Salahuddin Bakery, for example, generations of bakers have been baking sweet and savoury goods like their palm-sized Bengali curry puffs and flaky puff-pastry cream cones in their trusty charcoal oven. There's also Restoran Hua Mui, a halal joint that has been around for more than 70 years and serves a Hainanese chicken chop dish that's fried to crispy perfection, and slathered with thick sweet and sour gravy. It comes with a side of chunky tomato, potatoes and peas.

Of the newer spots, some standouts include **The Replacement**, a Melbourneinspired eatery with whitewashed walls and minimalist décor. Enjoy speciality coffee like the piccolo latte which is





smooth and offers a good caffeine kick. At Flowers in the Window, nature adorns the space with bird's-nest ferns hanging at the front of the shop and monstera plants in every corner. All the greenery mixed with the wafting smells of freshly made European pastries make this space a calming haven. *Bandar Johor Bahru*

①6pm Photogenic fun

Enjoy a sunset view along the shoreline of **Danga Bay**. Also, be ready with your cameras as the lights turn on at the **Danga Bay World Theme Park**, a permanent funfair where you can enjoy classic rides like the merry-go-round and carousel. It's pure old-school fun. *Skudai Highway*, *Danga Bay*

Ø 8pm Primed for dinner

Wind down at **Les Bouchons**, a fancy Parisian restaurant with a view of the harbour. Enjoy a chunky piece of Australian Black Angus rib-eye or sirloin steak, free-flow, cooked-to-perfection fries, and a glass of exquisite French wine. Don't miss the smooth crème brûlée with its perfectly caramelised crust. It's just divine. *R-GL1, Menara Teega, Lebuh Laksamana, Puteri Harbour, Iskandar Puteri*

This four-star option is minutes away from the Johor Bahru Checkpoint and even offers free shuttle services to it. The shuttle route also includes several malls in the vicinity, such as Mid Valley Southkey and KSL City mall. frasershospitality.com



① 10am Walk on air

The glass-floored **Sky Bridge** at **Skyscape** – Johor Bahru's first aerial entertainment space – gives you a picturesque view of JB city at a dizzying 149m above ground. You'll even be able to see a part of Singapore across the Johor Straits. If you'd rather skip the Bridge, there are VR games and interactive floor games. Take a souvenir snapshot at the 30m **LED Tunnel**, where the latest lighting technology synchronises with music. *Level 34, Menara JLand Johor Bahru City Centre (JBCC), Jalan Tun Abdul Razak*

① 12pm One more for the road

A must-try Johorean signature dish is *kacang pool*, a hearty bowl of thick, slightly spicy gravy made of broad beans, ground peanuts, minced beef and curry spices, topped with a bullseye egg and served alongside thick margarine toast. A local twist on an Egyptian dish known as *ful medames*, the recipe was passed on from Arabian merchants and altered to suit local taste – it uses ghee instead of oil, and limes instead of lemons to give it a zesty tang. You haven't truly experienced JB if you've not tried it at the original **Kacang Pool Haji**. *Gerai 3, Medan Selera Larkin, Susur 5, Jalan Abdul Razak*





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Saigon steps up

Fine-dining chefs in Ho Chi Minh City are charting new culinary territory in whimsical and wonderful ways

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The French may have designed Ho Chi Minh City's historic centre, but the Vietnamese have made it their own.

Vendors hawk iced coffee and tropical fruit juice beside heritage buildings like the Central Post Office. Tangled alleyways fan out from outspread boulevards and verdant parks. Pavements are not for long, languid promenades – like they are in Paris – but the venue for Ho Chi Minh City's famed street food scene.

A decade ago, this culinary cacophony may have drowned out Oryz Saigon, which opened in October. Here, mellifluous chatter flows through the restaurant's tenderly lit dining room. Curious diners gaze at imaginative creations. Aromas waft from the open kitchen, where a skilled team moves with precision. Although it's only been around for a few months, Oryz feels like a well-drilled machine, a reliable dining destination to mark special occasions – anniversaries, perhaps, or personal milestones – and is one of the more recent examples of Ho Chi Minh City's transforming dining scene.

"The Saigon fine-dining scene is flourishing," says Peter Cuong Franklin, the Vietnamese-American founder and head chef at Anan Saigon, which brandishes Ho Chi Minh City's only Michelin star. Since establishing his restaurant in 2017, the former investment banker has seen a revolution in the restaurant scene, and he believes that it's time for overseas impressions to catch up.

"Most travellers' perception of Vietnam is still stuck in the Bourdain era," says chef Peter, referring to Anthony Bourdain, who covered Vietnamese street kitchens for his culinary-adventure TV series in the 2000s, dined on *bun cha* in Hanoi with Barack Obama in 2016, and sadly passed away in 2018. "It's seen as the place for cheap street food – not fine-dining experiences."

Quick lunches at everyday eateries cost \$2 (VND50,000), while well-prepared meals at more upmarket establishments charge about \$10. By contrast, tasting menus at fine-dining restaurants hover around the \$100 mark, and cost more if diners are drinking beer or wine.

Defining fine-dining isn't easy, but of the 55 establishments listed in the inaugural Michelin Guide Hanoi and Ho Chi Minh City, which launched last June, more than a third offer an undeniably high-end experience. Like Oryz, most of those high-end restaurants offer some form of tasting menu, a progression of small dishes that reflects the *chef patron*'s mission and philosophy. For many, this is a hallmark feature of a fine-dining establishment.

Despite international perceptions, Oryz has in fact stepped into a somewhat crowded scene. Chris Fong, the Singaporean head chef, did a lot of soul-searching before committing to Ho Chi Minh City. After working in more than a handful of Asian countries, he considered opening restaurants in Melbourne, Guangzhou and Singapore, but ultimately decided that this was the place to put down roots.

The next challenge for chef Chris and his team was to identify gaps in the market. "We realised that everyone is doing modern Vietnamese, a kind of fusion," he says. "Other than Japanese omakase, East Asian dining is not really represented here." Some dishes, such as their bun bo hue - spiced beef tartare, pickled banana blossom and crunchy rice-cake parcels, a recipe that refines the taste of the beef-noodle dish from Central Vietnam - take inspiration from local cuisine. But some menu highlights, including the duck herbal soup - minced duck, pumpkin leaf tempura and charcoal cassava root - clearly draw from further afield. "Diversity is what we really stand for," says Chris.


The chef emphasises that a pan-regional approach will also guide future innovations. Ideas in the pot include a tasting menu that diverges from French dégustation and pioneers a distinct Asian progression; communal kaiseki-style multi-course menus suited to multi-generational dining groups; and take-home recipe cards. "We are thinking about how we can transform the experience," says Chris.

Nén Light, which opened in 2022 and appeared on the Michelin list a year later, is also looking to transform the fine-dining experience, though perhaps in a more fanciful way. Tucked down an alleyway and encircled by a garden of bamboo, wax apple and Muntingia trees, the restaurant is a calming refuge within a hectic neighbourhood. Guests enjoy a small appetiser and welcome drink in the leafy garden before moving to the minimalist dining room – ideal for quiet couples – and embarking on a journey.

Founder and head chef Summer Le believes that every creative product needs a story, and she has incorporated this idea into her tasting menus, which she calls "Sto:ry Menus". Sto:ry Menu #5, which runs this month, is called "Days of 22", and is inspired by chef Summer's time as a student in Japan from 2006. The playful final main course is a Japanese pilaf with black chicken and Tonkin jasmine. The fun part is the seasoning. Diners can flavour the dish with spice mixtures that are meant to represent the characters from Doraemon, a Japanese comic book popular with Vietnamese millennials like Summer. "We do what we like," she laughs, "and what we think makes sense."

Eccentricities also abound at Peter Cuong Franklin's Anan Saigon, a rowdy restaurant with tight, cloth-less tables that evokes the downtown dining scenes of New York or Hong Kong. "When it's so compact you have a sense of energy in the room," says chef Peter, who was born and raised in Vietnam before being evacuated to the United States as a child refugee in 1975. "You can hear what your neighbours are saying, and that's kind of fun."

Though a modern fine-dining restaurant, Anan remains Vietnamese at its core, a kind of extension to the boisterous decades-old market on its doorstep. The tasting menu is speckled with dishes that are inspired by Vietnamese favourites, like Le Petit Banh My, a bite-size take on Vietnam's iconic sandwich, and River Prawn Banh Xeo Taco, a homage to the small rice crêpes of Hue in central Vietnam. Franklin's formula is working wonders; his informal diner was voted Best Restaurant in Vietnam by the Asia's 50 Best judges this year.

But the chefs helming the restaurants seem unconcerned. As chef Peter puts it: "If we try and meet other people's expectations, we will lose our identity." ■



Here be dragons

Diving with seadragons, visiting a garden protected by the mythical creature and cheering on dragon boats – just some of the fun and unique ways to ring in the Year of the Dragon in Sydney

harismatic, intelligent, confident and powerful. They're the

personality traits of people born in the Year of the Dragon, but these adjectives could just as easily apply to Sydney. The Australian city is undeniably charming, with its sparkling harbour, laid-back lifestyle and renowned food scene.

If you happen to be in town for the Lunar New Year, then your good luck has already started. Recently named the 10th wealthiest city in the world – with an estimated 126,900 millionaires, 184 centi-millionaires and 15 billionaires – Sydney oozes the ideal vibe for calling in prosperity as the Lunar New Year ushers in the Year of the Dragon. The mythical beast, the fifth animal of the Chinese zodiac, is associated with good luck, strength and health, so bring it on!

Kids and dragons

Dragon-related activities to fuel the imagination of young ones

WATCH DRAGON BOATS RACE

About an hour south of Manly by public transport, the beating of drums signals a fearsome battle on top of the water in Darling Harbour, near the Sea Life Sydney Aquarium and the new, restaurantlined Barangaroo precinct. People of all ages gather along the waterfront to cheer on teams as they race in the annual Lunar New Year Dragon Boats Festival.

The event, happening on 16–18 February, is free for spectators and begins with a traditional eye-dotting ceremony or awakening of the dragon, to rouse the 12m-long dragons and ensure a safe weekend of racing. For extra good fortune, Taoist monks also perform a blessing of the waters.

If you don't catch the dragon boats, don't worry – the wider Sydney Lunar New Year Festival, which has been running since 1996, goes on for a longer period. Originally known as the Chinese New Year Festival, it was renamed in 2020 to include the many national communities taking part, from Chinese and Malaysian to Vietnamese and Mongolian, among others.

This month, the festival will run from 10–25 February. Highlights include food markets with live music in nearby Haymarket, home to the city's Chinatown. When you've had your fill of noodles and dumplings, head to one of the ticketed cultural performances that span dance, music, theatre and storytelling. Expect everything from Chinese folk dancing and Japanese drumming to K-Pop. And don't forget to look up at the end of each day, when the skies light up with spectacular firework displays.

Learn about Komodo dragons, Australian water dragons and other lizards at a **Reptile Keeper Talk** at Taronga Zoo Sydney. Held daily at 11am, the informative sessions are free with zoo entry. **taronga.org.au** What's the difference between eastern and western dragons? Find out at the Sydney Opera House's free **Design Your Own Dragon** class, then create your own artwork to take home. sydneyoperahouse.com Find Chinese dragons – and the remaining 11 animals of the Chinese zodiac – in **The Emperor's Quest**, an educational treasure hunt held daily in the Chinese Garden of Friendship. *darlingharbour.com*



DIVE WITH SEADRAGONS

An otherworldly creature lurks several metres below the surface of the water. Sporting leaf-like appendages, and purple spots and stripes, its marigoldcoloured body is camouflaged among the kelp, where it uses its long snout to feed on crustaceans. The weedy seadragon might be considered fearsome if it wasn't a willowy 30cm long. A relative of the seahorse, seadragons are endemic to New South Wales and you can see them in the wild in Sydney on a guided dive.

Spanning an area of roughly 20ha, Cabbage Tree Bay is a protected aquatic reserve off the southern end of Manly Beach, a 30-minute ferry ride from the city. The reserve is home to some of the most diverse marine life in Sydney, including octopuses, stingrays and wobbegong sharks. There are brightly coloured nudibranchs, and inquisitive eastern blue gropers – the fish emblem of New South Wales. If you're lucky, you may even spot a turtle.

But if it's dragons you seek, you'll need to swim to the outer reef to the "dragon patch" as it's affectionately known to locals. Dive Centre Manly, which has been in business for 30 years, offers guided dives of Cabbage Tree Bay. You'll need to bring along your dive certification, and you can rent their gear or use your own. Not certified? They also offer a great dive experience for beginners. *divesydney.com.au*

VISIT A GARDEN OF DRAGONS

In need of some tranquillity to counter the festivities? Make your way to the koifilled ponds, gentle weeping willows and intricate pavilions of Darling Harbour's Chinese Garden of Friendship. Opened in 1998 as a symbol of unity between the sister cities of Sydney and Guangzhou in China, the 1.07ha compound was modelled after Ming Dynasty private gardens and designed to encourage the flow of *qi*, or internal energy.

Native magpie larks flit among Himalayan cedars, sacred ibis forage in the bamboo forests, and Australian water dragons bask on sun-splashed rocks by the pond. The lizards are Australia's largest dragons, growing to a length of 80–90cm, and while they're usually shy, they seem to feel confident enough being in



You can learn all about the history, landscape and cultural heritage on the garden's daily guided tours. 

MAG adds 248 additional flights through to March 2024 to accommodate increased festive travel

Malaysia Aviation Group (MAG) has announced a significant boost to flight frequencies to meet travel demand through to March 2024, with the addition of 248 flights in its domestic and international network. The additional flights are offered on both Malaysia Airlines and Firefly, departing from KL International Airport Terminal 1 (KUL), Subang Airport (SZB) and Penang International Airport (PEN).

CABIN LUGGAGE HANDLING Passenger and crew safety on board our flights are our highest priority. Large devices with screen size above 12 inches are not allowed to be used during takeoff and landing. Whilst cruising, all devices can be used in "Flight Mode". Devices transmitting cellular and signals to satellites must remain switched off throughout the flight, until disembarkation. The Captain may prohibit the use of devices if there is any interference with the aircraft's system.

LITHIUM BATTERIES

(x Lithium metal or lithium ion cells or batteries for portable electronic devices (PEDs), including medical devices, must not exceed 2g for lithium metal batteries and 100Wh for lithium ion batteries. All spare batteries, including lithium metal or lithium ion cells or batteries, for PEDs must be carried in passengers' carry-on baggage only. These batteries must be individually protected to prevent short circuits. PEDs containing non-spillable batteries, they must be 12V or less or 100Wh or less. Penang Hill, also known as Bukit Bendera ("Flagstaff Hill") is part of the Penang Hill Biosphere Reserve, a Unesco inscription awarded last year for its wonderful collage of natural terrain: dipterocarp forests, coastal rainforests, mangroves, sandy beaches and marine habitat.
