Sosodikon Hill is home to Kundasang's agro and rural tourism

Kundasang, with its rolling terrain and cool mountain air, stands as Sabah's vibrant heart of tourism and agriculture. Known for its breathtaking landscapes and iconic landmarks like Mount Kinabalu, this area has blossomed into a destination for agro and rural tourism, complete with a variety of homestays and farm stays that invite visitors to experience its natural wonders.

Thanks to a RM750,000 grant from the Ministry of Rural and Regional Development in 2022 under the Desa Lestari programme, Koperasi Sosodikon Ranau Berhad (KOPSODIK) has spearheaded sustainable village development and agro-tourism in Kampung Kauluan, Kundasang. Anchored by the popular Sosodikon Hill, KOPSODIK has recently launched the Sosodikon Sunflower Farm, which serves as both a scenic flower garden and a glamping site.

The Sunflower Farm, fully managed by KOPSODIK's female members, offers them an income source through entrance and camping fees that support the farm's upkeep. Tourists who stay in the rural homestay programme can also engage with these members, learning firsthand about flower planting and gardening.

At an altitude of 1,176m above sea level, Kundasang is also Sabah's largest producer of highland vegetables. KOPSODIK's 13 full-time employees manage a thriving commercial operation, cultivating crops like cabbage, tomatoes and sweet potatoes, adding another income stream for the co-operative.



Once a subsistence farming village, Kampung Kauluan has embraced technological advancement to boost crop production, now selling surplus harvests in Kundasang town. Tourists can join the farmers in planting and harvesting vegetables, immersing themselves in the daily rhythms of KOPSODIK's agricultural life.

Looking ahead, KOPSODIK aims to introduce chemical-free practices, exploring hydroponic and aquaponic systems to enhance sustainability. By integrating these methods, they envision a holistic rural tourism experience that not only immerses visitors in village life, but also strengthens the local economy through ecotourism.

A 500-piece jigsaw puzzle captures the quirky charm of Phnom Penh BY TARA FT SERING

"Anyone who's spent a day in

Phnom Penh will probably have seen something out of the box," says 34-year-old artist and illustrator Tessa Polder (in photo), the creative force behind Monsoon Illustration and Design studio.

Tessa first moved to Cambodia's capital to work as an intern, but her original six-month stint stretched on to six years as she fell in love with the city. And what she loves about Phnom Penh shows up in quirky illustrations that perfectly capture the city's spirit: freewheeling, sometimes chaotic, always exciting.

"When I first arrived in Phnom Penh I was immediately struck by the many things going on around me all at once and the sense that 'anything goes'," she adds. But once she had a

better grasp of the city, the organised chaos became a large part of its charm. "One of my stand-out-moments was seeing a huge stack of mattresses piled high on the roof of a van, and on the very top was a guy just chilling, scrolling casually on his phone. I was also wowed the first time I saw monkeys climbing the electricity wires as if they were jungle vine."

These and other quirky scenes feature in the delightful Phnom Penh City Jigsaw Puzzle, available online and at For Someone I Like, a charming boutique of thoughtful, artisan-made goods - from ceramics and jewellery to handwoven fabrics and fashion accessories - in the city's Tuol Tompoung area, not far from the Russian Market. The set makes for a perfect holiday souvenir, and piecing together the puzzle is a great way of reliving the fun of navigating Phnom Penh's narrow downtown streets, lined with shopfronts and bustling with tuk tuk drivers and vendors. instagram. com/monsoon.illustration

Beyond the bar

Southeast Asia is a booming

hub for artisanal chocolates celebrating the local cacao - there's Marou from Vietnam, Auro from the Philippines and Krakakoa from Indonesia, to name just a few. In 2019, WAT Chocolate, Cambodia's first bean-to-bar company, put the country on this map. Cacao from Mondulkiri in eastern Cambodia is harvested then processed in Siem Reap and turned into gluten-free, mostly vegan chocolate bars of varying intensities (we love dark chocolate of at least 70% cacao content), all available at Wat Temple of Cacao in Phnom Penh's bustling BKK1, an enclave of hip hotels, swish residential tower blocks and trendy restaurants. It's a cosy spot for treating yourself to a tasty hit of cacao, from bon bons and soft serve ice cream topped with roasted nibs to drinks. Feeling extra indulgent? The signature cold chocolate drink is topped with a high swirl of chocolate ice cream. Don't forget to bag some bars; they come in beautiful packaging individually screen-printed by village women in Pondicherry, India, as well as a range of unique flavours, including Kampot pepper. Pick up a boxed set of five or six for the folks back home or for your own stash. watchocolate.com

Central perks

Stay in the heart of
Singapore and find
plenty to love in the city

The charming thing about the

Little Red Dot is how pockets of areas in the city are rich in historical trivia. For example, not many would know that Coleman Street, between Armenian Street and St Andrew's Road, was once an enclave of private mansions. It was named after George D Coleman, Singapore's first architect who was instrumental in designing and constructing much of the island's early infrastructure. In 1829, he built his residence (later called Coleman House) on that street. Today, that site is where the modern **Peninsula Excelsior Hotel**,

A Wyndham Hotel stands. Most of its 591 suites and rooms offer stunning views of the beautiful Marina Bay and the city Coleman helped envision.

The Executive King Room – with its plush king-sized bed and sweeping views of the bay – is perfect for a romantic weekend. For families or groups, the Deluxe Triple Room provides three comfortable single beds.

Start your day with buffet breakfast at Coleman's Café (they open at 6.30am), then put on your walking shoes. Historic buildings like the Armenian Church (which Coleman designed) and the

Children's Museum Singapore are a hop and skip away. You'll also be within walking distance of Raffles City Shopping Centre, Funan Mall, Marina Bay Sands, Clarke Quay and Chinatown. Want to venture towards Orchard Road's iconic shopping strip without breaking a sweat? The City Hall and Clarke Quay MRT stations are five minutes away by foot.

Your travel rights in Malaysia


Pushpalatha Subramaniam, Malaysian Aviation Commission Director of Consumer and Public Affairs, shares key air travel protections every consumer should know



When it comes to air travel, knowing your rights can make all the difference in your journey. With the Malaysian Aviation Consumer Protection

Code 2016 (MACPC), the Malaysian Aviation Commission (MAVCOM) has established clear protections for consumers flying into and out of Malaysia, covering both local and foreign airlines.

MAVCOM Director of Consumer Affairs Pushpalatha Subramaniam outlines some of the most important rights you have, broken down into key phases of your travel journey.



YOUR FLIGHT Know what you're paying for

No hidden fees: Ever booked a flight only to find unexpected costs at checkout? Under the MACPC, airlines are required to display the full, all-inclusive price – which comprises government taxes, charges under any written law, mandatory fees and surcharges – in their advertisement and before consumers purchase their tickets. This transparency means no more surprises – just the actual price from the start.



Optional add-ons only with your consent: Airlines can't sneak in extra services by default. Any additional options, like insurance or extra baggage allowance, must be offered clearly and as an opt-in service. That way, you pay only for what you actually want.

Key tip: Before making a purchase, read and understand the terms and conditions regarding cancellation fees; policies on refund, rebooking, baggage allowance and no-show (consumer not turning up for a booked flight at the airport); as well as validity of your travel documents.



COMMUNICATION OF CHANGE IN FLIGHT STATUS Stay informed

Communication when there is a change in the scheduled time of departure: Airlines must inform consumers of any schedule changes, says Pushpa. For instance, if your flight is rescheduled by three hours or more,

MAVCOM requires the airline to notify you as soon as practicable, or at least 24 hours from the scheduled time of departure. For routes that have been discontinued by the airline, the airline is required to provide a notification at least one month before the scheduled departure date.

Flight cancellations and refunds: In case of a flight cancellation, you have the right to choose between a full refund or rerouting to your final destination. The refund should be processed within 30 days in the same form of payment you originally used.

Tip: Keep an eye out for notifications from your airline to stay updated on any scheduled changes to your flight. If there's a flight disruption, reach out to the airline promptly to explore your options.



AT THE AIRPORT Rights during delays and denied boarding

Delayed flights: If your flight is delayed for two hours or more, you're entitled to essentials like meals or refreshments, internet access, and limited phone calls. If the delay is five hours or more, you are entitled to the previously mentioned care, as well as hotel accommodation and transportation to and from the airport if an overnight stay is necessary. However, if you decide not to continue your journey, you can request a full refund from the airline, according to Pushpa.

Flight disruptions caused by extraordinary circumstances: For flight disruptions beyond the airline's control (e.g., weather, delays, cancellations, rescheduling, or route cessation), airlines must refund the full ticket cost, including taxes and fees, in the same form of payment you originally used within 30 days. Airlines may offer alternative forms of refund such as vouchers or credit shells, but the choice of refund method rests with the consumers.

Denied boarding protections: An airline may only deny consumers from boarding an aircraft if consumers voluntarily surrender their reservations or if there are insufficient volunteers. Any denied boarding must occur before consumers board the aircraft. If you are denied from boarding, you are entitled to a full refund or rerouting with comparable transport conditions – including meals or refreshments, phone calls, internet access, as well as hotel accommodation and transport, if needed.



AFTER YOUR FLIGHT Dealing with refunds and baggage claims

Mishandled baggage: Lost, delayed or damaged baggage? Under the MACPC, you should file a complaint with the airline immediately upon arrival or within seven days for damaged baggage and within 21 days for delayed baggage. However, consumers are strongly encouraged to file a written complaint upon arrival.

Tip: You should keep all receipts to validate your claims for essential items purchased.

Refunds for unused flights: If you were unable to board a flight, airlines are required to refund mandatory charges, including fuel surcharge, taxes, fees and charges imposed by government and prescribed under any written law, as well as charges imposed on consumer by airlines. This applies to both refundable and non-refundable flight tickets.

Complaint resolution by airlines within 30 days: Airlines must resolve consumer complaints within 30 days, with consumers allowed up to 2 years to file their complaint.



FLYING WITH DISABILITIES Special considerations to know

MACPC's regulations prioritise accessibility for travellers with disabilities.

Airlines must provide free wheelchair assistance to those with an OKU (Orang Kurang Upaya) card. It is recommended that the request be sent to the airline at least 48 hours prior to departure. If your mobility equipment is damaged or lost during a flight, you are entitled to compensation based on the equipment's current market value.

Travel insurance

While MACPC offers protections for your travel, travel insurance can provide added peace of mind. If you encounter situations outside of the MACPC's scope - such as medical emergencies or related expenses arising from flight cancellations or rescheduling, such as hotel or transportation costs-travelinsurance may cover expenses that the airline cannot. However, coverage depends on your insurance policy. It is advisable to review your plan before travelling, as having insurance can provide a more comprehensive safety net, says Pushpa.

The MACPC is here to protect and empower you as a traveller, making sure that air travel remains fair and transparent. By understanding these rights, you're not only safeguarding your journey but also contributing to a more accountable and consumerfriendly aviation industry. Travel confidently by planning ahead and staying informed about your air travel rights.

Know when to seek help

If you encounter an unresolved issue with an airline or are unhappy with the resolution provided, MAVCOM offers a reliable avenue for lodging complaints. You can file a complaint through flysmart.my or the FlySmart mobile app. MAVCOM advocates for fair and transparent treatment, ensuring that consumers feel empowered to assert their rights. A Malaysian in... **Taipei**

Raito Low, a stop-motion animator who has called Taipei home for a decade, shares her top spots to visit in the city **BY SHERMIAN LIM**



In middle school, I read a lot of literature from Taiwan and I frequently watched Taiwanese films and TV shows. These gave me a strong sense of how much Taiwan prioritises social issues that impact its communities.

My exposure to the culture inspired me to move from Johor Bahru to Taipei for a degree in communications design of 3D animation at Shih Chien University. As a stopmotion artist, I bring everyday objects to life, capturing them frame-by-frame to create surreal visual stories. I work with items like plants, stones and cultural artefacts. Each piece of material tells its own story, bringing depth and vitality to my animations.

I'm currently back in Malaysia for an artist residency, which led to the creation of my latest piece, Cha Bute Mening, meaning "little shiny things" in the Kenyah language, spoken by a tribe in Sarawak. This work highlights the beautiful beadwork used by the Kenyah and Kayan tribes in their traditional crafts. Over the past few months, I've showcased Cha Bute Mening at several new media art events, including IMMERSIO at GMBB mall in Kuala Lumpur, running until 22 December. Taipei's convivial vibe, artistic freedom, vibrant cultural life and ease of living make me feel at home and keep me inspired. I'm excited to share some of my favourite places to check out around town.

Meet fellow creatives

Treasure Hill Artist Village, a

historic cluster of old homes built by Kuomintang veterans, is a 10-minute walk from Gongguan MRT station. Now a vibrant creative community, artists from around the world live and work







here, displaying unique works yearround. Visitors can stroll through lanes filled with murals and spaces with outdoor sculptures, relax at cosy cafés or browse local snacks and toys at the traditional Treasure Hill Tangerine Store. *travel.taipei*

Feel the (indie) music

The second floor of Revolver in the Zhongzheng district is a late-night live music venue and features many independent bands. The









music genres here range from rock and metal to punk and hip hop to electronic and experimental – plenty of serendipitous opportunities to discover new bands to add to your playlist. It's very popular with both expats and locals. *revolver.tw*

Art and culture hubs

The **Taipei Fine Arts Museum**, one of Taiwan's premier art museums, offers a wide range of international

exhibitions in a bright, spacious setting with affordable ticket prices. There's also Huashan 1914 Creative Park, a former tobacco factory turned arts and culture hub. The cinema here is my favourite spot – it screens unique films by directors like Wong Kar-wai, Edward Yang and Hou Hsiao-hsien. It's also a popular venue for film festivals. english.tfam.gov.taipei; huashan1914.com

Inspired by nature

Most of my creations are based on natural objects, so I collect plants along hiking trails. For tourists, I recommend Fuzhou **Shan Park** (stop at Linguang station on the brown MRT line) and Xianjiyan Trail (stop at Jingmei station on the green MRT line). Both trails are easy and take less than one hour to complete. Taiwan has 34 out of the 39 species of ferns found in the world and you'll get to observe lots of these on the trails, along with native birds like the Formosan blue magpie - don't get too close as they bite! The peak of the trails also offers beautiful views of Taipei. travel.taipei

A taste of Taipei

Huayin Street is famous for authentic Taiwanese street dishes such as beef soup and more adventurous offerings like snake meat. Due to Taiwan's historical Japanese influence. Japanese food is also very prominent in the city and Hizen Ya in the Zhongshan district is worth a visit. It's an old-school Japanese restaurant that serves some of the best rice bowls, grilled skewered meats and fried dishes in Taipei. The unadon (eel rice) is particularly popular, often drawing long queues.

For a caffeine fix

My colleagues recommend

La Grotta, a small café with
a homey vibe in the bustling
Ximending area. Their dessert
selection changes regularly—if
it's available, try the hazelnut
basque cheesecake. Another
well-known coffee shop is Hafu
Coffee in Banqiao. Say hello
to a few of their resident cats
while enjoying hand-brewed
coffee and home-made desserts.

The great outdoors

You must visit Shitiping - East Coast National Scenic Area in Hualien County. It's a stunning coastal gem with surreal volcanic rock formations carved by the ocean. Imagine blue waves crashing against rugged cliffs while you explore tidal pools full of marine life. It's perfect for snorkelling, fishing, hiking or just soaking in the dramatic views of the Pacific Ocean. There is a large Amis population here, so take the opportunity to try authentic indigenous cuisine like grilled flying fish, taro or seaweed dishes. eastcoast-nsa.gov.tw





Mesmerising national parks

Search the high jungle canopy for wildlife or explore the depths of some of the world's largest underground passages and caves. Sarawak's incredible national parks offer endless adventures for nature lovers.

In Mulu National Park, a Unesco World Heritage Site, guided multi-day hikes lead travellers closer to the park's natural wonders. The spectacular Headhunter's Trail is a popular choice, taking hikers deep into the rainforest via longboat to walk trails still used by indigenous tribes. Those looking to encounter Sarawak's iconic Pinnacles will undertake a near-vertical journey, using ladders and ropes, which rewards fearless adventurers with





incredible views of the park's famous 60-million-year-old limestone spires. Mulu National Park is also home to all eight of Sarawak's spectacular hornbill species and the impressive Sarawak Chamber, the largest cave chamber in the world.

On the coast, Niah National Park, Sarawak's second and newest Unesco World Heritage Site, offers anthropology-loving travellers caverns filled with archaeological wonders, including ancient cave paintings and the discovery site of the oldest human remains in Southeast Asia. Further south, Bako National Park welcomes wildlife lovers to get close to Bornean bearded pigs, saltwater crocodiles and large-nosed proboscis monkeys, endemic to the jungles of Borneo. These comical creatures are one of Sarawak's biggest attractions, typically spotted lounging on the branches of mangroves early in the morning.

In Kuching City, **The Borneo Cultures Museum**, the largest museum in Malaysia and the second largest in Southeast Asia, celebrates the geography, history and cultural heritage of the Island of Borneo over five floors and 30,000m². This incredible state-of-the-art attraction has welcomed more than a million visitors since opening in 2022 and includes modern interactive displays, artefacts such as weapons, beading and crafts, Borneo totem poles, replica buildings and a children's gallery.

World-class events

Building on its natural wonders and cultural attractions, Sarawak is home to a growing number of cultural events that showcase the region's rising stars in music, food and the arts.

At the Nyamai Sarawak Gastronomy Festival in Kuching, a Unesco Creative City of Gastronomy, visitors experience Sarawak's diverse culinary traditions, warm hospitality, unique ingredients and legendary Sarawak laksa. Tribal delicacies from local indigenous groups are also popular, including Nuba *laya*, a Kelabit speciality of mashed rice wrapped in leaves; stir-fried *midin*, a wild jungle fern enjoyed by the Iban; and preserved seafood specialities from the Melanau.

During the Rainforest World Music Festival, visiting and local artists perform for an international audience, bringing indigenous languages and instruments to the stage in a powerful celebration of diversity. At the Sarawak International Festival of Music and Arts, traditional and contemporary artists, musicians and dancers perform and offer workshops to inspire and educate attendees.

With an unwavering commitment to the preservation and celebration of its cultures and natural wonders, reflected in multiple Unesco designations and internationally recognised events, Sarawak has established itself as a leader in sustainable tourism.

Three amazing day trips from Kuching city

Hang out with orangutans
Semenggoh Wildlife Centre, 20
minutes from Kuching City, has
been rehabilitating injured and
orphaned orangutans since 1975
and offers visitors a chance to see
these incredible creatures in their
natural habitat. The centre feeds
the semi-wild orangutans living in
nearby forests twice daily at 9am
and at 3pm, which offers the best
opportunity to observe them in
their natural habitat.

Discover a fairy cave

Less than an hour from Kuching City, Fairy Cave Nature Reserve is an enchanting day trip to a whimsical, moss-covered cave within Gunung Kapor. The entrance to the cave is at the top of four flights of stairs, halfway up a limestone cliff. Once inside, the Twilight Trail and the Dark Cave Trail lead visitors along wooden walkways and winding staircases into the labyrinth of caverns, past nesting swiftlets, bats and eerie rock formations, to the spectacular main chamber.

Go frogging after dark

Kubah National Park, a 40-minute drive from Kuching City, is home to no less than 60 species of frogs and attracts nature lovers to experience the park's nocturnal chorus of croaking. Guided late-night frogging tours search for species including the pea-sized Matang narrowmouthed frog, often found living inside pitcher plants, and Wallace's flying frogs which use their webbed feet to soar through the air.



Sarawak is also home to Malaysia's 6th Geopark, the Sarawak Delta Geopark.









Kudat is probably best known for its pristine azure seas and powder soft, white sandy beaches. Amongst the beautiful beaches in Kudat, **Kalampunian Beach** is a standout as a popular picnic, swimming and camping destination. The beach also plays host to Sabah's annual surfing festival.

Ultimately, no trip to Kudat is complete without a visit to the **Tip of Borneo**. The hike up from Kalampunian Beach takes approximately 90 minutes, depending on your fitness level. There's a landmark of a giant bronze globe at the top of the hill. After a stop for photos, continue downwards to a set of steps leading to the cape, which is where Borneo Island ends on the northern side and marks the point where the South China Sea meets the Sulu Sea. *Tanjung Simpang Mengayau*

a jaw-to-the-floor visual feast that'll make you pinch yourself to check that you're not dreaming.

The gateway to the Maldives is Velana Airport, which is positioned by a stunning harbour. On arrival in high season from December to April, it is permanently abuzz with activity as hyper-excited tourists from around the world negotiate their onward journey to one of the myriad eye-candy resorts dotting this extraordinary island chain.

The Maldives is at once Asia's smallest nation-state, yet also one of its lengthiest at $90,000 \, \mathrm{km^2}$, its widely dispersed islands numbering almost 2,000. It can take up to an hour to fly by propeller jet from the fascinating, historically rich capital Malé to the southernmost resorts – a travel experience so indescribably beautiful, it defies reality.

Forty percent of all Maldivians are squeezed into Malé's tiny metropolis, one of the world's smallest capitals – an 8.3km² island packed with sights and artificial beaches. It takes approximately two hours to walk across from east to west. Maldivians have their own language, Dhivehi, though English – the country was colonised by the UK until 1965 – is the *lingua franca*.

Tiny though it might be in native population, this crystalline ocean-world is overloaded with rich indigenous culture, including its own currency (the rufiyaa), dialects and citrusy cuisine—largely from the sea's bounty; think snapper or trevally fish. If available, ask for *kandu kukulhu riha* (yellowfin tuna curry), tuna-and-coconut *mas huni* and spicy *kulhi kaaja* snacks; and if you only learn one Dhivehi phrase, make it *varah meeru* ("very tasty")—it'll soon become obvious why.

Dubai, Sri Lanka and Thailand necessarily export food to the Maldives' cosmopolitan resorts. Though

fruit and vegetables are in ample supply, lawmakers have wisely banned fishing for blacktip reef sharks, spinner dolphins and moray eels. This preserves the country's already mind-boggling biodiversity: hawksbill turtles, barracudas, grey herons, giant eagle rays, noisily cawing crows, manta rays and tropical fish schools. You'll also hear traditional *boduberu* music gracing the airwaves, and if you can, sail aboard an ornate *dhoni*, a colourful, distinctively shaped fishing boat.

AN IDEAL WAY TO EXPERIENCE THE MALDIVES IS A STAY

at an all-inclusive resort, where you largely don't have to worry about running a high tab on meals and activities, most of which will already be tucked into the price of the room or villa. Club Med pioneered this concept in the 1950s, and has kept that spirit alive at Club Med Kani, a short 30-minute speedboat ride from the airport.

A popular choice for families eager to snorkel among coral reefs and enjoy watersports, it also hosts the pricier Manta Exclusive Collection, a 70m² adults-only space with more than 60 overwater wooden stilts, each offering butler service. According to Rachael Harding, CEO of Club Med for East, South Asia and Pacific, Manta offers "an elevated level of personalisation and service that really leans on the trend that is luxury travel with a difference." The hospitality group is also gearing up to open its first property in Malaysia next year, in Kota Kinabalu on Borneo island.

The relatively simplified set-up of Club Med Kani feels rather refreshing, with just two restaurants – The Kandu and The Vehli – offering buffet spreads and a la carte menus respectively; pampering at a spa; and the blissful release of lazing the day away on a whitesand beach. Excursions include day-tripping to Malé,







an option offered by few Maldivian resorts, a "lobster picnic" and an array of land-based leisure sports (padel tennis, anyone?) and Club Med's signature trapeze, as well as more strenuous aquatic adventures.

Further along the luxe scale is Conrad Maldives Rangali Island. Last year, the property completed sweeping renovations led by the esteemed New York-based Japanese architect Yuji Yamazaki. "The vision," says general manager Thomas Hoeborn, "was to elevate each guest's experience by blending seamless indoor-outdoor living, sustainable practices and timeless elegance, ensuring that the natural beauty of the Maldives remains central to the experience."

The Conrad pioneered the underwater-villa concept with The Muraka, which to date only one other resort (Pullman Maldives Maamutaa) has emulated. This oneiric experience allows six people to fully immerse in the sub-aquatic universe swimming silently mere metres away. Sitting pretty in South Ari Atoll, a halfhour seaplane flight from Malé, visitors may choose between beach villas with outdoor bathrooms or plunge pools, and interconnected overwater villas.

There's an emphasis on enjoying the sea and its various inhabitants - one notable tour is the whaleshark yacht excursion, where guests search for this majestic species prevalent in local waters, then enjoy swimming alongside the gentle giant. As you enjoy champagne and canapés, you may also find playful dolphins somersaulting through the Indian Ocean. There are also turtle tours and sunset fishing boat trips that offer the opportunity to catch your own seafood dinner.

Another resort is Soneva Fushi, and although more remote, has plenty to keep everyone busy. It's perfect for multigenerational travel, featuring South Asia's biggest kids' club (The Den) alongside 63 villas strung across the white-sand beach, lush gardens and huge Water Reserve residences on Unesco-protected Baa. Atoll's Kunfunadhoo Island. It's one of four sustainable properties under the Soneva brand name - alongside Jani in Noonu Atoll; the brand-new, ultra-personalised 14-villa Soneva Secret on Makunudhoo Atoll; and the Kiri beach resort in southern Thailand. The prestigious chain is known for its focus on both local and international experiences, such as visiting Michelin-star chefs and sports stars.

The phrase "barefoot luxury" might sound cliché, yet perfectly describes Soneva Fushi, where every villa comes with a 24/7 "Barefoot Guardian" and guests need never don shoes. The brilliant water slides into the ocean affixed to the Water Reserves are just the start; the two-storey "Crusoe" residence comes with a steam room, of all things, while the Sunset Reserve sprawled around a superannuated banyan tree is fitted with swings.

Padel tennis courts, the Maldives' first zipline and trending Seabob motorised watercrafts top the list of exhilarating activities, while 11 dining destinations



are dotted around Soneva Fushi, all innovative in their own way, are blessed with pun-tastic names like Carne Diem, Flying Sauces and Once upon a Table. Soneva's eco-efforts aren't to be sniffed at; it partners with NGO Save Our Seas and the Olive Ridley Project, while its own foundation helps grow coral reefs.

wellness seekers. "[It's] a new destination for wellness," says Jeneena Schatz, marketing and PR manager for Joali Being, a whole resort designed around well-being programmes, a first in the Maldives. "The nature, peace and clean air, along with the hospitality of the Maldives, attract a number of travellers." Joali Being, a true resort original, arrived as "mindfulness" and "responsible travel" became buzzwords in 2021 – a "well-being island" set on calm, secluded Bodufushi in Raa Atoll. Its ethos has four central pillars: mind, skin – think anti-ageing treatments – microbiome (the interaction of a community) and energy.

"It all began with spa treatments that evolved into more," says Jeneena, who adds that the resort recognises the rise of a particular type of traveller: the leisure and wellness seeker. "Wellness for us isn't just a one-time detox; it's a way of life where your daily food, physical activities and experiences are centred around healthy habits." It's a paradigm that even extends to the wide selection of sustainably sourced food-and-drink venues on offer, which include options for all possible tastes; "earth-to-table", pescetarian, Japanese and Mediterranean cuisines.



A journey towards global leadership

Following the historic ASEAN-China Ministerial Roundtable, Malaysia is redefining living through innovative housing strategies and robust international partnerships

create a harmonious blend of modernity and tradition," said Nga.



In the northern Indian state of Uttar Pradesh, there is a town called Kannauj, known for producing attar or perfume oils.

Although I was born and raised in India, I have never visited Kannauj. But it has existed in my olfactory imagination for years. The town is also known for producing *mitti* attar or the distilled essence of petrichor, the smell of the first rain on parched earth.

My memory of petrichor goes back to the years I spent in the arid heartland of north India. Embedded among my early childhood memories is the longing for rain that followed a long, blistering summer, and the euphoric relief when the smell of wet earth would rise from the ground after the first showers.

Unforgettable in its fleeting intensity, petrichor is better experienced than described. Sitting at my desk in Manila, the closest I can come to that specific scent that's burnished in my memory is by opening a small, glass bottle of Maati, an attar by Boond, a boutique, modern-day fragrance house from Kannauj.

Like most attars, Maati is sold in a small, no-frills glass flacon. I use the glass wand attached to the screw top to daub a few drops of the attar on my pulse points. Unlike modern



perfumes, which focus on sillage – or the perfume's ability to project and linger – attars drape themselves to the skin. Maati reveals itself in the hushed decibels of an intimate secret – a suggestion of earthiness, suspended in a heart of musky sandalwood. It isn't exactly how I remember petrichor to be, but it is transportive in its ability to evoke a specific time, place and season.

Boond is one of a growing number of independent perfumers and brands in South and Southeast Asia who are creating fragrances that are closely inspired by the ethos of those places. Reflective not just of terroir – or the specific soil and climatic conditions that influence their composition – but also of provenance or a more encompassing sense of place, these fragrances open a unique portal to global exploration.

LET'S CONSIDER SALTED GREEN MANGO, ONE OF THE NICHE

fragrances created by Thai perfumer Prin Lomros under his brand Strangers Parfumerie, for instance. It opens with an intensely fruity note with a slightly acrid edge, like slices of semi-ripe mangoes sweating in the midday sun. As time wears on, the fragrance mellows into something sweeter and fruitier but with an unmistakable edge. I imagine a mobile vendor on the streets of Bangkok briskly slicing mangoes and dousing them with coarse salt, the sweet scent of the fruit wafting amidst the smoke and fumes of the city.

Some of Prin's other fragrances, produced under his labels PRIN and Parfum Prissana, also evoke the ethos of his native Thailand, in bold, unusual and even unsettling ways. Featuring Previous spread:

notes of tar, hay, ambergris (or deer musk), skunk musk and even burning tire, alongside more conventional elements like floral, fruity and gourmand notes, it's clear that Prin's perfumes are not meant for mass approval. Independent perfumers like him create space for perfumery to exist as an art beyond the Eurocentric values that largely define its contemporary existence.

Most modern perfumes can be linked to Grasse, the French city that has been synonymous with the craft since the 16th century. A town once renowned for its tanneries but notorious for the stench that they generated, Grasse spun its disadvantage into an enviable calling card. Dotted with flower fields that produce precious raw materials, along with the ideal terroir to harness their fragile essence, the city is thought to have perfected the techniques and processes that define the industry today. Most famous "noses" or experts who compose fragrances have acquired their training in Grasse, and it is where many of the world's leading luxury fragrance houses and large companies source their ingredients from.

However, the reality is that with perfumery being a highly lucrative and competitive industry, it is only a select few with means who have been able to gain access to Grasse. As a result, perfumery is considered a guarded world that perpetuates a code of exclusivity. Most famous noses working today are overwhelmingly of French or European ancestry, and while their artistry is beyond debate, it does open the thorny yet important question of gatekeeping and the space – or lack thereof – for diversity.

Bharti Lalwani, an art critic-turned-perfumer, founded Litrahb Perfumery, an independent label focussed on natural fragrances based in Pune, India – a three-hour train ride from Mumbai – partly in response to this gatekeeping. "Art and academic institutions are built for public good yet their format of knowledge production does not lend itself easily to the public," Bharti tells me. Looking to apply her critic's eye to the aesthetics of a different – yet interconnected – discipline, she founded Litrahb Perfumery in 2018.

The first fragrance project that she took on was expansive in its ambition but with an element of fun in its approach. "Bagh-e Hind" was a virtual art exhibition or what Bharti calls "an immersive garden oasis", which allowed viewers to experience the sensory setting of paintings and poetry from the Mughal era through music, poetry, photographs and fragrance. Created in collaboration with academic scholar and horticulturist Dr Nicolas Roth, "Bagh-e Hind" offered a synesthetic immersion into the milieu of these paintings through specially crafted perfumes and edible perfumes. Each of the five chapters of the exhibition, dedicated to a flower, had an accompanying set that included a parfum, a flavoured tea, an edible perfume, a perfumed soap and objects that recreated or were reminiscent of the period.

According to Bharti, the objective of the project was to take the experience of history out of a distant museum setting and to bring it to one's fingertips (and taste buds), so to speak. "For our Narcissus chapter in 'Bagh-e Hind', I created the effect of 'eating narcissus' by beating into sugar trace amounts of saffron, tuberose and Jasminum grandiflorum extracts," wrote Bharti. "I then dusted dried apricots with this perfumed sugar. The sensorial impact is such that one chews and tastes fruit but smells flowers! The idea is to access our history, our heritage, our gardens and our flowers, with a light-handed playfulness."

VARUN AND KRATI TANDON, THE SIBLINGS

who co-founded Boond in 2021, are also trying to reclaim history in their own way. Hailing from Kannauj, Krati says her family has always been involved in the attar trade. However, it was during the pandemic years that the siblings decided to make their foray into the business. "It was during this time that we saw the fragrances and perfumeries of our town in a new light," Krati tells me. "We realised their unmatched beauty and the great heritage value they hold."

The decision was also hastened by the body blow that the pandemic dealt to the industry that sustains Kannauj's economy. "It was also during this time that we saw the artisans and perfumeries struggle first-hand and were worried that the pandemic could be the final blow to our indigenous art," says Krati. "We wanted to try and help the artisans and to revive the ancient Kannauj art of perfume making."

Kannauj has been associated with perfumery for over 400 years. The form of perfumery practised here even to this day is old school, both in its form and application. Unlike modern perfumes, which use a small percentage of fragrance concentrates (such as fragrance oils) diluted with alcohol as a solvent or base, attars are highly concentrated perfume oils that use sandalwood oil as a base.

Attar is painstakingly distilled using deg-bhapka, a traditional technique that involves steaming flowers, woods and resins in a copper still called the deg and collecting the condensation in a receiver called the bhapka. It is a resource- and time-intensive process, with an end-product contrary to the high-octane glamour of western perfumery.

But Krati says that their customers have been receptive to the idea of rediscovering the quiet gravitas of attar. "We've found that customers are eager to experience fragrances that are nostalgic and unique, and our

fragrances are just that for an Indian audience," said Krati. "Whether it is the celebratory Motiya (Jasmine) and Audh (Agarwood) or the nostalgic Maati, most Indian customers love or at the very least are curious about these since they've heard about them from their elders. For international customers, the fact that the fragrances are oil-based, sustainably made and alcoholfree are major draws."

The burgeoning success of Boond, Litrahb and Prin are an indication that a growing number of consumers are ready to embrace an unconventional approach to perfume. This is a shot in the arm for independent perfumers looking to forge their identity in a competitive environment. Today, more than ever, a fragrance does not need to be conventionally pleasing to find an audience. Why shouldn't fragrances reflect the complex, layered reality of the places that they are rooted in?

This question comes to mind when I meet Renato Lopena Jr, the perfumer behind Wren Atelier, a boutique perfume brand based in Manila, where I now live. In a market dominated by clean, fresh, largely inoffensive scents that Filipinos favour for the tropical weather, Renato is trying a different path. Having trained at the Grasse Institute of Perfumery after giving up on

his initial career path of becoming a chef, Renato's creations are a bit like the Philippines itself – bold, occasionally challenging and greater than the sum of its parts. I try Hacienderos (Spanish for farm owner), a fragrance that Renato says is his "homage to Filipino landowners and farmers". With a bright flourish of bergamot and lemon that belies a base of barnyard, hay and dirt, Renato says it is a "clean yet dirty" scent.

When he launched Hacienderos in 2021, Renato was wary about the reception. "The first batch of Hacienderos was just 50 pieces," he told me. "It was very risky, and I didn't know if it would hit or not. But it was sold out in a matter of five days." That initial success propelled him to launch more scents as part of his private collection under Wren Atelier, including Banqueros, a marine fragrance underpinned by notes of seaweed and squid ink, and Cosa Nostra, my personal favourite, a smoky, leathery perfume with a strident note of gunpowder, which softens as it lingers on your skin.

They may not be meant for a quick spritz when you are running late for a meeting, but Wren Atelier's perfumes offer pause when you have a moment to spare. At least in part, they tell the story of a complex culture with layers upon layers to peel back. It's clear that Renato has many more stories to craft – he's just getting started. "My target as a brand is to not really be conventional," he says. "Here in the Philippines, we still love fresh fragrances because of the weather. But I want my brand to be artistic and niche."

ON-TIME PERFORMANCE Our check-in counters close 60 minutes before departure. Please allow at least 45 minutes for immigration and security clearance. Boarding gates will close 30 minutes prior to departure.

CABIN LUGGAGE HANDLING Passenger and crew safety on board our flights are our highest priority. In compliance with the airline's policy and in observing Occupational Safety and Health Regulation requirements, cabin crew are no longer required to stow passengers' hand luggage in the overhead stowage compartments. This is to minimise occupational hazards and ergonomic risks faced by cabin crew in the aircraft. Cabin crew on duty will, however, assist passengers travelling with infants, young passengers travelling alone, the elderly and passengers with reduced mobility. Passengers who are fit and in good health must carry, stow and secure their hand luggage on board. Hand luggage exceeding the 7kg weight limit must be checked in before boarding.

PORTABLE ELECTRONIC **DEVICES (PEDs)**

For safety reasons, in line with the Civil Aviation Authority of Malaysia guidelines, mobile phones and small PEDs can be used throughout your journey in "Flight Mode". Large devices with screen size above 12 inches are not allowed to be used during takeoff and landing. Whilst cruising, all devices can be used in "Flight Mode". Devices transmitting cellular signals to satellites must remain switched off throughout the flight, until disembarkation. The Captain may prohibit the use of devices if there is any interference with the aircraft's system.

LITHIUM BATTERIES × Lithium metal or lithium ion cells or batteries for portable electronic devices (PEDs), including medical devices, must not exceed 2g for lithium metal batteries and 100Wh for lithium ion batteries. All spare batteries, including lithium metal or lithium ion cells or batteries for PEDs, must be carried in passengers' carry-on baggage only. These batteries must be individually protected to prevent short circuits. PEDs containing non-spillable batteries must be 12V or less or 100Wh or less. Passengers are allowed to carry a maximum of two spare batteries onboard. These batteries must be individually protected to prevent short circuits.
