












### **Bridging continents**

The riverside town of Henley-on-Thames, a quick train ride from London, offers a quintessentially English experience BY JONATHAN EVANS

#### In David Fincher's Oscar-winning

drama The Social Network, a Harvard crew narrowly fails to win a rowing race, darkening the mood of the Winklevoss twins who vow to sue Mark Zuckerberg. It's a tension-filled cinematic moment set at the Henley Royal Regatta, one of Britain's most famous sporting fixtures and, for some, a highlight in the summertime social calendar.

Every July since 1839, the rowing event has lured pan-global athletes and cosmopolitan visitors – including British royalty - to Henley-on-Thames, an exceptionally beautiful town sprawled regally around its eponymous river for centuries, less than an hour by train from central London (via the Great Western Railway from Paddington or an Elizabeth Line train from Tottenham Court Road, with a change at Twyford).



Over several days of the splashy summer regatta, there are clashes between men's and women's crews representing college students from Oxford and Cambridge universities (whose legendary rowing rivalry dates back to the early 1800s), as well as between schools, clubs and

Chapman – to swish eateries along one of Britain's most romantic riversides, complete with swans and mallards.

Yet much of this ageless utopia, suffused with a pervasive nostalgia, remains just as I've always known it. A day's visit usually begins with a pub lunch at a sun-drenched spot at either The Angel on the Bridge (1728) or The Old Bell (1325), both housed in Grade II-listed buildings (protected structures of special architectural and historic significance). The meal is often followed by a stroll along stone-paved streets and alleys, with detours into The Bell Bookshop or Bagatelle Toys along Bell Street. Perhaps an arthouse film at the delightful Art Deco-styled neighbourhood cinema, the Regal Picturehouse, or a peek inside The Kenton Theatre, one of the country's oldest performance venues, housed in a brick-clad Georgian building.

But for something truly unhurried, nothing beats a chartered boat cruise (book at Hobbs of Henley along Station Road), drifting past some of England's loveliest country homes. *hrr.co.uk* 

even Olympic-level competitors. This quintessentially English summertime staple sees strawberries and fruity Pimm's plucked from wicker hampers, smartly clad guests and music at the Henley Festival.

A 12th-century settlement that blossomed into a prosperous trading post in the 1800s, Henley is a picturesque spot in Oxfordshire, flush with Tudor architecture and mews houses. But the timeworn yet polished town is also a modern haven for gourmets, shoppers and aesthetes – one that's worth a visit any time of the year. No wonder pop legends George Harrison and Dusty Springfield – who's buried in the churchyard of the 800-year-old St Mary the Virgin – chose to make it their home.

That same sensation of discovering new light through old windows follows visitors throughout this eminently walkable town. On my first post-Covid visit, I found familiar buildings inhabited by new occupants, from The Red Lion pub – now housing the boutique hotel The Relais Henley, home to the acclaimed Restaurant Dominic

### Earn your stripes

Head out of **Delhi** and into Ranthambore for a tiger-spotting adventure by Khursheed Dinshaw

> Three Gypsy vehicles grind to a halt on the mud path in Ranthambore Tiger Reserve, the biggest and most renowned tiger reserve in the Indian state of Rajasthan, located in Sawai Madhopur. This scene is what we had all travelled for and you could hear a pin drop in the silence. The tiger, majestic in its orange-and-black stripes, stares back with disinterest. We scramble to take pictures, clicking away in a fevered rush. Twenty minutes later, the tiger yawns, flicks its tail and walks away to become one with the forest.

The guide tells us that we'd just had a celebrity encounter - the tiger



belongs to the family of Machli's, aka T-16, considered the world's most photographed tigress, a powerful and dominating Royal Bengal who once won a fight with a 14ft-long crocodile. Machli was the park's most famous resident before she passed away in 2016, generating a whopping USD\$100 million in revenue for the reserve in the span of 11 years. Her lineage continues with her granddaughter T-84 or Arrow-Head (named for the arrow-shaped mark on her forehead) and great-granddaughter T-124 or Riddhi. Out of the world's dwindling tiger population, over 70% live in India, with 78 in Ranthambore, including Machli's descendants.

As with all bucket list adventures, planning is key. The cooler winter months from October onwards are an ideal time to visit when the animals are more active. It's a train ride from Delhi to the city of Sawai Madhopur: from there, a 30-minute drive to Ranthambore. Apart from the magnificent native flora, see if you can spot the resident fauna: a tigress and her cubs on a walk or chasing prey, leopards stalking the area, deer feeding on the grass and sloth bears perched in the trees. ranthamborenationalpark.com



If time permits, I'll explore the city and browse independent retailers at PMQ. Evenings are for sensuous dinners at Grand Majestic Sichuan or cosy vibes at Blue Supreme, which specialises in American comfort food and craft beers. For a nightcap, it's DarkSide or Salisterra; think jazz, cocktails and a city view.

#### Where to eat, work and unwind

When I work remotely, I look for places with garden terraces or airy spaces to help me feel grounded. **Tai Kwun** is one of my go-tos, whether it's grabbing a coffee at **Between** or taking a meeting at **Old Bailey**.

**Duddell's** is another, for its exquisite food and a hidden garden terrace. **Louise** at PMQ feels like a private residence, ideal for work and quiet catchups.

If you travel as much as I do, you learn how to balance the personal with the professional. For a quick reset in between meetings, a foot massage at Ten Feet Tall is a must; it's one of those places only locals would know. For deeper relaxation, the Asaya wellness retreat at Rosewood is next level. Meanwhile, Dragon's Back is my escape. It's a ridge trail with ocean views and total serenity.

Hong Kong is also a shopping haven. Lane Crawford at IFC and Pacific Place offer a beautifully curated lifestyle experience. For tailored menswear, I go to The Armoury. For vintage, American Vintage Shop in Causeway Bay has an incredible selection and I love wandering Star Street in Wan Chai for its boutique finds.

How I host in Hong Kong

When I want to impress out-oftown guests, I take them to **The China Club**, a colonial-era gem with old Shanghai glam and incredible Cantonese cuisine. Owned by my good friends, it has hosted everyone from Kate Moss to Madonna. Dim sum by day, duck and Chinese opera by night; it's not just a meal, it's a Hong Kong story.

For architecture lovers, start at Central where colonial-era gems like **St John's Cathedral** sit beside icons such as the **HSBC Building** by Norman Foster. My favourite new icon is **The Henderson** by Zaha Hadid; it is bold, curved and futuristic.

M• always sparks ideas. Yayoi Kusama's retrospective there – with its infinity rooms and installations – is a full-body, heart-stirring experience.

If I only have one weekend in Hong Kong, I'd do dim sum at City Hall, hop on the Star Ferry, cocktails at Hutong, and for something unexpected, a dai pai dong dinner under neon lights in Sham Shui Po.



#### Raise your voice

Mezzo-soprano Samantha Chong brings her global experience home, mentoring Malaysia's next generation of opera stars

Samantha Chong may be based in Hong Kong but her heart beats for home. The internationally acclaimed mezzo-soprano is on a mission to give back - one masterclass at a time.

Originally from Kota Kinabalu, Sabah, Chong launched her career after winning the first ASEAN Vocal Competition in 2016. Working with diverse students has deepened Chong's appreciation for music's power to unite people. She's found that language barriers fade away, leaving only a shared connection through art.



## Adelaide

From farmers' markets and leafy parklands to bustling laneways and live music, here's how to make the most of three days in the city



South Australia's capital city is proof that good things come in small packages.

> Adelaide feels intimate yet big enough to hold its own, offering plenty of art, food options and natural beauty. While the nearby wine regions like the Barossa, Clare Valley and McLaren Vale are world-famous, the city itself is worth exploring. From sweeping hills all the way down to the ocean, Adelaide feels like a microcosm of everything that makes Australia so wonderful, and a weekend here can be both indulgent and refreshingly uncomplicated.

#### **FRIDAY**

Morning. Pop into Central Market, the city's culinary heart, which opens at 7am and where you can easily spend several hours. With over 70 traders under one roof, this vibrant indoor market is a feast for the senses. First order of business? A power breakfast of egg tarts.

Queue up at Saudade Portuguese Custard Tarts, a heritage shop along Grote Street devoted to baking the perfect pastel de nata; take a bite and you'll see why one tart is never enough. Spend the better part of the morning filling your basket with weekend picnic supplies: crusty bread and Basque cheesecake from Dough Bakery (stall 45) and a selection of cheeses from Smelly Cheese Co next door. For brunch, locals swear by the steaming bowls of laksa at Asian Gourmet, while the Market Plaza Food Court offers plenty of options, from dumplings to sizzling plates of black bean beef.

**Afternoon.** For a dose of art and history, walk a few blocks north of the market to Adelaide's stately cultural precinct on North Terrace. Begin at the Art Gallery of South Australia. Housed inside a grand sandstone building beside the leafy forecourt of the University of Adelaide, it's one of the city's most iconic institutions. Inside, you'll find an eclectic collection, from Indigenous carvings and colonial-era paintings to edgy contemporary installations like Chiharu Shiota's Absence Embodied, a haunting 200km web of red wool, and Evening shadows, backwater of the Murray, South Australia (1880) by HJ Johnstone, the gallery's first acquisition.

Nearby, you'll find the State Library's Mortlock Wing, often counted among the most beautiful libraries in the world. Even if you're not a bibliophile, the atmosphere (think Hogwarts meets the Downton Abbey estate) is pure magic.



Where to stay

Book a lounge pass with Journify and relax before your flight.



Take a moment to admire some of Adelaide's historic churches all around you. There's **St Peter's Cathedral**, with its Gothic Revival architecture, and **St Francis Xavier's Cathedral**, known for its sandstone façade and serene interiors – a nod to Adelaide's past as the "City of Churches".

**Evening.** As dusk settles, Adelaide's East End comes alive. Rundle Street is aglow with twinkling fairy lights and the warm spill of laughter from curbside tables. Start at one of the small wine bars tucked along Rundle and Vardon Avenue, perhaps Mother Vine or East End Cellars, where candlelight dances on exposed brick walls and bartenders pour South Australian Shiraz by the glass. Before the night ends, toast the city from 2KW Bar, with sweeping views of the illuminated Adelaide Oval and distant hills. With a glass of wine or mocktail in hand, it's the perfect end to your first day.

#### SATURDAY

Morning. Make the most of your morning with a visit to the Mount Lofty Summit, just 20 minutes by car from central Adelaide. Drive east to the trailhead at Waterfall Gully and prepare for a hike that feels like stepping into another world. The trail winds through lush fern gullies and towering eucalyptus trees, with the scent of damp earth lingering in the air. As you climb steadily upwards, pause to notice the birds flitting through the canopy and to catch glimpses of the city unfurling below. The 4km return hike is steep but rewarding; at the summit, panoramic views stretch from Adelaide's suburban patchwork all the way to Gulf St Vincent shimmering in the distance. Don't want to work up a sweat? The summit is accessible by car.

Afternoon. Just a short drive from Mount Lofty lies Cleland Wildlife Park, where you can get closer to Australia's iconic animals than almost anywhere else. Wander through 35 hectares of open bushland and hand-feed kangaroos, wallabies and emus as they roam freely around you. The park is also home to koalas, wombats and rare species like the Tasmanian devil. Hot tip: for an unforgettable experience, book a Koala Close-Up session.

**Evening.** Explore the city's West End, starting out at Peel Street, for its hidden bars and stylish eateries. Stay for a drink at Maybe Mae, a subterranean cocktail bar with Art Deco glamour; think plush green booths, dim lighting and an expertly curated drinks list. Or opt for light bites at Bread & Bone, a loft-style eatery above Peel Street that serves wood-grilled burgers and bar snacks in an industrial-chic space, to

set the evening mood. From there, head to **Jive**, an indie venue with retro décor and a cheerful bar, or **The Gov**, Adelaide's premier live music pub where blues, rock and folk spill out onto the street, drawing crowds well into the night. For a bigger sound, **Hindley Street Music Hall** brings global touring acts and local legends to its gritty, no-fuss stage. This is Adelaide at its most vibrant: music, laughter and a city with rhythm.

#### **SUNDAY**

**Morning.** Sundays in the city are made for slow starts. Head to the Adelaide Farmers' Market, a lively open-air market held every Sunday morning at the Adelaide Showground. It's where local producers showcase the region's finest, from fresh berries and organic vegetables to handmade pastries. Pick up something sweet from Jamface, a bustling market stall where MasterChef judge Poh Ling Yeow serves up her signature creations: buttery tarts, glossy cakes and indulgent bakes that disappear fast. Don't miss her millefeuille, which is many-layered, decadent and as delicious as it looks on TV.

Afternoon. Depending on the weather, you might want to head down to the picturesque, café-lined streets around Glenelg Beach, about 40 minutes by tram from the central business district. If you'd rather keep it local, take your picnic supplies to the more central

Adelaide Botanic Garden. Unfurl a blanket under the towering Moreton Bay figs, watch as vivid lorikeets and rosellas flit through the branches and enjoy the calm of the Palm House and Amazon Waterlily Pavilion. The garden is one of the city's green lungs, a lush and peaceful spot ideal for relaxing as the weekend winds down.

**Evening.** For your final night in Adelaide, treat yourself to the bold, vibrant flavours of Africola, a South African-inspired gem on East Terrace. Helmed by chef Duncan Welgemoed, the restaurant's eclectic interiors and dynamic menu have drawn global attention, with dishes that are as playful as they are delicious. Alternatively, savour the authentic tastes of Soi 38 on Pirie Street, where regional Thai cuisine is crafted with sustainably sourced ingredients. Think betel leaf with blue swimmer crab or a fragrant jackfruit and eggplant green curry. Both Africola and Soi 38 are much-loved local favourites, so reservations are recommended to secure your spot.

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## Steaks worth flying for

Why this flameforward Penang steakhouse is gaining national attention and fans beyond Malaysia

Some come to Penang for the street food. Others, for the history. But for a growing number of travellers, there's another reason to book a table, and maybe even a flight: steak.

Not just any steak, but one grilled over open flame, kissed with mangrove smoke and served in a setting that's as relaxed as it is refined. At Firewood Penang, flame-grilling isn't just a cooking method; it's a philosophy. And it has earned the restaurant a place on the World's 101 Best Steak Restaurants, the first and only Malaysian entry to make the list. It's also Michelin Selected, cementing its reputation as a dining destination worth seeking out.

Tucked away in Unesco-listed George Town, Firewood's rise is fuelled by an honest, ingredient-led approach. At the helm is chef Ker Yang Hao, who favours simplicity over spectacle. "With fire, you can't fake it," he says. "It teaches you patience and instinct." That reverence for process runs through every dish – from steaks aged and



grilled in-house to sides inspired by Malaysian flavours, like the umami spices and rendang butter.

The steak selection is compact but compelling, with signatures like the Stone Axe Australian Wagyu Striploin, the Firewood Sirloin and a dry-aged Wagyu Tomahawk & Prime Rib. Each showcases depth, texture and a distinct kiss of smoke.


While steak is the star, there's plenty beyond the grill like local shellfish, ember-roasted vegetables and comforting sides like truffle mashed potatoes or chargrilled okra with pink peppercorn. Pair these thoughtful dishes with wine curated to complement the fire-forward flavours.

But beyond the fire, it's the people who fuel Firewood. Chef Ker's team includes young chefs encouraged to grow creatively and front-of-house staff known for their genuine warmth.

There's no formality here. Just a belief that food, when made with care and cooked over an open flame, leaves a lasting impression. For travellers chasing memorable meals, Firewood Penang isn't just a stop; it's a destination worth flying for.

With an abundance of heritage architecture, flavourful cuisine and the wisdom of Ayurveda infused into daily life, the southwestern state of Kerala makes for an excellent introduction to the marvels of India. From the serene shores of **Trivandrum** to the spice-laden streets of **Kochi**, Malaysia Airlines offers two distinct gateways into this unforgettable region

#### Whenever first-time travellers to India ask me where they should go, the easy answer is Kerala,



and the state's 590km-long coastline along the Arabian Sea, meandering backwaters, forested interiors and mountains wrapped in tea, pepper and cardamom are just some of the reasons why.

I tell them to start in the middle, in Kochi, a city defined by thousands of years of trade and commerce. Greek, Roman, Jewish, Syrian, Arab and Chinese traders arrived here in search of the prized spices in the ancient world, like cloves, cinnamon, nutmeg and black pepper. The Portuguese established their first settlement in India here in the 15th century, and Kochi later fell into the hands of the Dutch and the British. All these influences have left their mark, from the patinaed colonial-era houses and stone-paved bylanes of the old quarter (Fort Kochi), to the 33ft-high Chinese fishing nets set against the Arabian Sea and the spice boutiques near the Portuguese-built Mattancherry Palace, with its terracotta roofing and central courtyard.

Today, charming heritage boutique hotels such as Le Colonial - an intimate, luxurious hideaway along Vasco de Gama Square in Fort Kochi - set the tone for a richer exploration of history. "My mother and father travelled to India in the 1970s and promptly fell in love with Kochi," says owner Isabelle Persenda. "Just like them, I've also been charmed by Kochi."

In the early 2000s, her parents bought an old colonialera home, originally built in 1506 to house Portuguese governors, and transformed it into Le Colonial with the help of architect Ramesh Tharakan, who specialises in heritage restoration. In many ways, this elegant hotel - with its wood-panelled walls, vintage furniture and antiques - stands as a witness to those who have travelled through Fort Kochi and have been similarly enchanted.

#### I OFTEN COME TO KERALA FOR THE CUISINE, AS MANY

others do. Specifically, for the sadhya, a feast of 25 to 30 vegetarian dishes and rice served on banana leaves, ubiquitous during the annual harvest festival Onam in August and September. The meal itself is a celebration of the bounty of the land.

From Kerala-born chef Jomon Kuriakose, culinary director at the restaurant chain The Tiffin Box (with branches across the United Kingdom and United Arab Emirates), I've learned that Keralan cuisine reflects everything that surrounds it: the Arabian Sea, the Western Ghats and the monsoon-fed fields. "It's a place where food is deeply seasonal and instinctively local," he says. "What sets Kerala's food apart is clarity and flavour. We don't mask ingredients. We elevate them." Ingredients such as coconut, shallots, curry leaves, tamarind and spices like cardamom, cloves and black pepper are used not just for heat, but for depth, aroma and balance.

For Kuriakose, Kerala's food speaks of trade, migration, faith and celebration. These nuanced influences appear in Syrian Christian fish moilee with coconut milk and green chillies, Portuguese-inspired vindaloo, Moplah Muslim biryani flavoured with dry fruits and ghee, Jewish-style pickled mangoes and temple sadhya rooted in Ayurvedic, plant-based principles. "Few places in India offer such culinary diversity in such a small space," says Kuriakose.


For a taste of this intersection of anthropology and food, dine at The History & Terrace Grill, a lavish restaurant at Brunton Boatyard in Fort Kochi. Set on a former harbourfront shipyard with lofty ceilings, terracotta floors, teak furnishings and vintage art, the hotel is part of CGH Earth, a hospitality brand offering community-led stays across South India. Chefs here have been tending to the culinary legacy of the town's diverse communities, crafting a menu that includes dishes like Portuguese-inspired seafood stews, Anglo-Indian recipes of tender duck in coconut gravy and

chuttulli meen, where the fish marinade follows a Jewish family's handwritten recipe.

#### NO VISIT TO KOCHI IS COMPLETE WITHOUT A TRIP TO

its surrounding backwaters, running parallel to the Arabian Sea. The backwaters consist of a network of waterways that twist and turn, snaking past paddyland, coconut groves and local homes. They include lagoons,

lakes, canals, rivers and deltas, both man-made and natural, shaped by tidal currents that create tiny islands across the coastal landscape. Locals use this vast network for transport, fishing and farming. Now, it's also a place for houseboat cruises, especially in Alleppey, 53km south of Kochi.

To manage the impact of tourism, luxury houseboats like Spice Routes are creating more responsible experiences by anchoring their boats in the quieter village of Chennamkary and welcoming travellers in a two-century-old heritage home that sits on a 7-acre private farm before cruises begin. The houseboats, ranging from one to five bedrooms with ensuite bathrooms, accommodate only one group at a time. Meals are delightfully local, with fish, lobsters and mussels sourced from the fishermen along the canals. Their single-bedroom boats come with a glass-covered lounge, sundeck and a jacuzzi, ideal for gazing at the surrounding landscape.

#### MAKE YOUR WAY TO THE CAPITAL OF TRIVANDRUM,

where you'll find fabulous beach towns, such as the popular Kovalam, as well as many of Kerala's prominent Ayurveda institutions. The southern city is a centre for Ayurveda, a natural, holistic medicinal system that emerged in India over 5,000 years ago. Based on the principles that everything in the body is intertwined, Ayurveda incorporates lifestyle changes and natural remedies to achieve balance and harmony in the body, mind, spirit and the world around us. "A calm body is required for a calm mind," says Dr Neeraja Radhakrishnan, founder of Nerium Ayurveda and Wellness. In Ayurveda, doshas are energies that govern our health. The essence of Avurveda is primarily to restore the balance of these doshas, and to bring a person back to their prakriti (inherent nature), Radhakrishnan says. Therapies like Shirodhara, a healing technique that involves slow-dripping liquid – usually oil or milk - onto the forehead, soothe the hypothalamus, promote deep relaxation and restore balance.

In the heart of the backwaters in Paravur, 56km north of Trivandrum, is the CGH Earth's Kalari Rasayana, an Ayurveda centre located on an 8-acre coconut garden with 22 lakefront rooms. With 11 treatment spaces, Ayurveda programmes here start at 14 days – the minimum time for therapies to take full effect. Treatments are prescribed by doctors and address conditions like stress, insomnia, hormonal imbalance, diabetes and digestive issues, combining detox, massage, yoga, meditation and diet. There's also preventive healthcare, an evolving global trend as more people turn to Ayurveda to curb and prevent illnesses.

"The monsoon season is considered an ideal time for cleansing and taking medicinal porridge to preserve our health," Radhakrishnan says. Traditionally, locals combine cleansing treatments and herbal decoctions with therapies like Shirodhara and Abhyanga, an oil body massage that relieves muscle tension, improves blood flow and calms the mind. Known as karkidaka chikitsa, these monsoon rituals are part of Kerala's lifestyle that treat seasonal ailments like cold, cough, indigestion and chronic conditions like arthritis.

The heritage, cuisine, houseboats and Ayurveda aside, the state's rich nature and the warmth and hospitality of its people fit into the narrative of God's Own Country, a tourism slogan first used in the 1980s, now synonymous with Kerala. For Radhakrishnan, it's this atmosphere that fosters a deep sense of well-being across her home state.

And for me, every visit to Kerala feels vibrant and alive. Isabelle Persenda reminds me that Fort Kochi, for instance, is still the sleepy seaside town where time seems to have forgotten its meaning, but events like the Kochi-Muziris Biennale, India's biggest art exhibition, which takes place every two years, transform the town with creativity, colour and cultural expression. "Moments like these," she says, "remind me how special this place truly is."




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

How does a city roll out the red carpet for a truly memorable visit? Some of Indonesia's savvy creatives, bullish business executives and world-class acts share some open secrets

#### First, coffee

Indonesia is one of the world's largest coffee producers, growing a variety of robusta and arabica beans, from the fullbodied, chocolate-flavoured Sumatra and Java to Toraja and Kintamani. But the domestic café culture hasn't always been as robust. If recent years have seen Jakarta stake its claim as a coffee capital, it's thanks to a broad movement of homegrown entrepreneurs and connoisseurs, with Mikael Jasin, 2024 World Barista Champion, as one of its key players.

Jasin's career as a barista began 13 years ago in coffee-obsessed Melbourne, where he juggled work and school. Sensing that Indonesia's coffee culture was undergoing a remarkable transformation, he later moved back to Jakarta. Today, he juggles even more: his coffee exporting company, coffee consulting firm and a retail café called Omakafé in the outskirts of Jakarta. There, he focuses on creating an entire experience around coffee for customers, hoping to make it more approachable and less intimidating



for anyone who's trying to know more about this beloved beverage.

He believes that Jakarta's vibrant coffee culture is a key ingredient in making the city a well-rounded dining destination. This includes the product itself, from various interpretations of *es kopi susu* – an espresso drink with chilled milk and coffee grounds that settle at the bottom – championed by different brands, to speciality coffee crafted in different corners of the city.

Then there's the talent behind the brew. Baristas are on the frontlines of tourism, shaping visitors' experiences through both the quality of the interaction and the drink itself. Everyone remembers an expertly made cup, and a great barista is hard to forget. But, as with many hospitality roles in Indonesia, it's not often seen as a lucrative profession.

Jasin begs to differ, saying, "If you're a barista, there's an opportunity for you to do what you love because most baristas are really passionate about coffee. Do what you love, do what you're passionate about and still make a living – a really good living. Not everybody can be a world champion, but there's one every year, right? So there's enough opportunities for a lot of people."

#### **Great guides**

Jakarta isn't exactly famous as a walkable city, but that didn't stop Farid Mardhiyanto and friends from creating the Jakarta Good Guide (JGG), a popular walking tour of the city.

Mardhiyanto's career as a tour guide began with a revelation: after exploring different parts of Indonesia for work, he realised he didn't know enough about his own hometown, Jakarta. It was then, in 2012, that he began learning more about the city he grew up in through books and conversations, before eventually earning a guide certification from the local government. Two years later, inspired by a walking tour he'd joined in London, he launched his own version in Jakarta.

"I think Jakarta is a story to be told. If you walk on your own, it's so easy to get lost, and I think Jakarta is often understood simply as a big city with skyscrapers. It is that, yes, but there is more beyond that, and this is a story that the locals must share," says Mardhiyanto.

When JGG first started, its founders hoped it would help create a more wholesome impression of Jakarta aside from just being seen as a transit city. Now, they have bigger ambitions.

"Our hope [is for it to be inclusive, for people to feel welcome] to walk in the city,"

Mardhiyanto says. "We've found that many people who didn't use to walk much now use Jakarta Good Guide as a way to start exploring, even if it's just once a week on the weekend. At least there's this dedicated time when they can do it."

Walking, Mardhiyanto says, is what makes exploring Jakarta more meaningful for tourists. Knowing the ins and outs of the city's neighbourhoods, he takes visitors through hyper-local culinary spots and hidden corners of history even longtime residents might miss. For him, local markets and neighbourhoods are key to discovering the true heart of the city and its people.

"Try going to Glodok. It's a bit complicated to navigate because of the many small alleys, but it's in these alleys that you'll see people interacting in all kinds of ways. Glodok is also a very diverse place; people come from all kinds of ethnic and religious backgrounds, and they all share this space," he says.

#### Concepts with soul

If a spot is trending in Jakarta, it's likely backed by 20/WOL, a development and investment fund focused on lifestyle and creative ventures in Indonesia. Behind many of the city's buzzworthy establishments, 20/WOL has recently drawn attention on TikTok with clips of people trying artisanal treats from the Donut of Curiosity and the Korean-style patisserie Fragments, raving about the casual fine dining experience at Su Ma Jakarta or obsessing over the tiramisu at Scarlett's.

What drives the team isn't just success, but the stories and talents behind each brand. "We let the talent shine, and each talent is different," says Hadi Ismanto, 20/WOL's co-founder and managing partner, familiar to locals as the co-founder

and director of the online lifestyle magazine Manual Jakarta. "We are creating an ecosystem and platform where everyone can work together, not only in terms of creative expression and creative freedom, but also in terms of practicality," he adds.

Ismanto attributes his team's success in capturing the younger market to their focus on the entire customer experience, not just product quality - a notable feat given Jakarta's complex demographics and shifting tastes. Their success also comes at a time when the shrinking Indonesian middle class has already begun to impact Jakarta's lifestyle scene as consumers become more thoughtful about where they spend their money.

Ismanto says, "We want every brand we create to have a soul of its own, so you know that a lot of care has been placed into this venue."

For those on a short visit to Jakarta, Ismanto recommends exploring the city by districts, particularly the areas of Blok M, Senopati and Sudirman Central Business District (SCBD). While relatively close to one another, these districts each have their own signature offerings.

"If you're looking for something a bit more grassroots, inclusive and lively, go to Blok M," Ismanto says. "It's popular for its Japanese ramen, eateries and bars."

#### Hotels with personality

Tucked away on the outskirts of the Indonesian capital, Hotel Tentrem Jakarta is a relative newcomer to the city's hospitality scene, but it stands out for its embodiment of Javanese philosophy and culture.

Behind the establishment is owner Karina Pikanto, who has been intentional about every aspect of the hotel. "Every element, from the architecture and language to the gestures, artworks and culinary offerings, is carefully curated to honour our heritage," she says. "Each touchpoint is designed to guide guests through a seamless and emotionally resonant journey."

The hotel brings together Pikanto's multiple passions – architecture and interior design - along with her insights into travel and hospitality. "I love being able to create environments where every



detail, from the layout to the service, contributes to the guest experience," she says.

For Pikanto, "luxury" has evolved beyond opulence or excess and is now about crafted experiences. People are more willing to invest in moments of learning and connection, and the hotel meets this need by presenting a strong sense of place, incorporating Indonesian touches, whether it's through food, art or wellness programmes. The hotel's breakfast menu, for example, features traditional Indonesian soup – Pikanto's favourite - from the legendary chain Soto Betawi Haji Mamat. Javanese wood carving is a running theme throughout the property. The goal is to ensure guests experience the country's rich heritage even without stepping outside the hotel.

"Wherever possible, we prioritise working with local talent and sourcing local products, because we understand the influence we have in shaping who benefits from our success," says Pikanto.

Brought by Hainanese immigrants and refined over decades, the Hainanese chicken rice is a study in technique. The chicken must be tender but not mushy. The rice, never greasy, must carry the aroma of ginger and pandan. And the sauces? Balanced, bold and optional – but you'll want all three.

STREET FOOD THROUGH THE DECADES

#### BEFORE 1965 Roots of a foodie nation

Pushcarts sell cheap, regional dishes on crowded streets. Migrant communities shape Singapore's earliest food identity – informal, flavourful and essential to daily life despite poor hygiene and lack of regulation.

#### 1965-1979 Founding flavours

Street hawkers move into government-built food courts, led by Newton Food Centre in 1971. Sanitation improves, dishes become standardised. Chicken rice, mee rebus and satay emerge as everyday staples in a modernising city.

Long considered Malaysia's national dish, nasi lemak also speaks to Singapore's Malay roots. Served wrapped in banana leaf or on a plate, it comprises coconut milk-infused rice, sambal, fried anchovies, peanuts, boiled egg and cucumber. Some also add fried chicken, otak-otak (grilled fish cake) or even rendang.

Nasi lemak is known for its balance of flavours. The rice is creamy and aromatic, while sambal is spicy, sweet and smoky. Pile on an interplay of textures such as crunchy *ikan bilis* (anchovies) and runny egg yolk, no wonder this is considered the breakfast of champions, or for supper.

Though it sounds fiery, it's more tangy than spicy – a dish built on contrasts. The shell-on experience is part of the charm, cracking claws and licking sauce-drenched fingers.

First popularised in the 1950s, chilli crab now defines Singapore seafood dining, the kind you save for special nights and visiting friends. It's not just a dish – it's a ritual, best eaten with hands.

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

## **CABIN LUGGAGE HANDLING** Passenger and crew safety on board our flights are our highest priority. In compliance with the airline's policy and in observing Occupational Safety and Health Regulation requirements, cabin crew are no longer required to stow passengers' hand luggage in the overhead stowage compartments. This is to minimise occupational hazards and ergonomic risks faced by cabin crew in the aircraft. Passengers who are fit and in good health must carry, stow and secure their hand luggage on board. Hand luggage exceeding the 7kg weight limit must be checked in before boarding.

## **PORTABLE ELECTRONIC DEVICES (PEDs)**

For safety reasons, in line with the Civil Aviation Authority of Malaysia guidelines, mobile phones and small PEDs can be used throughout your journey in "Flight Mode". Large devices with screen size above 12 inches are not allowed to be used during takeoff and landing. Whilst cruising, all devices can be used in "Flight Mode". Devices transmitting cellular signals to satellites must remain switched off throughout the flight, until disembarkation. The Captain may prohibit the use of devices if there is any interference with the aircraft's system.

LITHIUM BATTERIES Lithium metal or lithium ion cells or batteries for portable electronic devices (PEDs), including medical devices, must not exceed 2g for lithium metal batteries and 100Wh for lithium ion batteries. All spare batteries, including lithium metal or lithium ion cells or batteries for PEDs, must be carried in passengers' carry-on baggage only. These batteries must be individually protected to prevent short circuits. PEDs containing non-spillable batteries must be 12V or less or 100Wh or less. Passengers are allowed to carry a maximum of two spare batteries onboard. These batteries must be individually protected to prevent short circuits.



## **NO-SMOKING & VAPING POLICY**

Smoking, including the use of electronic cigarettes, is prohibited on all flights. Electronic cigarettes must be carried in carry-on baggage only. Recharging of the device inflight is not permitted.
